

Stacey O'Gorman a solicitor from Community Legal Education addressed our Year 9 students on Monday about Social Media and the Law. She covered topics such as cyber-bullying, defamation and sexting. Her main teaching point was that students should always talk to an adult (parent, teacher or trusted person) if they



are being bullied online. She advised students that what they do now on social media could impact their future employment as employers check social media prior to employing. In the workplace she advised that what students put on social media can breach social media policies and therefore affect their employment. A final message to students was to not put on social media anything they wouldn't like their grandparents to see. This was Stacey's last visit to our College as the Community Legal Education advisor. We are very grateful for her time spent educating our students on legal matters over the past few years.


