



### **2017 Interhouse Athletics Carnival**

There was no more fantastic way to end Term 2 than with 2 days of sporting and athletic talent on display in the Interhouse Athletics Carnival. It brought together the Houses, students, staff and the whole College to celebrate and support the outstanding sporting talent we have here at Chanel. The weather could not have been more perfect and this ensured the carnival was a huge and successful event. The question that was on everyone's lips though was – "Would Futuna make it a 3-peat and take out all 3 carnivals in a calendar year for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row??

On the Thursday morning, students were itching for the start of the first event; all very eager to do show their talents and support each other and their Houses. The 100m event is the highlight of Day 1 and this year it did not disappoint. Many races were very close; needing photo finishes to see who crossed the line first. But the most exciting and pleasing thing about the 100m is the participation - all students in all age groups from all Houses run/skip/hop down the home straight all in the name of earning House points. It is events like this that show the true House spirit that has become a trademark of Chanel Interhouse carnivals. From the 100m race, the fastest 10 students are selected to take part in the Chanel Gift. A 110m race, with a staggered start based on time. This year, Year 11 student Lachlan Pacheco, clocked the fastest 100m time (11.09 seconds) and was the benchmark for the Chanel Gift. This race is spectacular to watch and the support these 10 runners receive outstanding. It was again a very close race with Lachlan almost chasing down all other 9 runners (some with a 20m head start), but in the end it was Sophie Duff who came across the line in 1st position -Congratulations Sophie and to all the Chanel Gift runners, it was a brilliant race! The field events see ALL students go to their events and participate - this is one of the beauties of the Chanel carnival, all students go with

their age group to all the field events and true House spirit and sportspersonhip are on display. They have heaps of fun at these events and all get in and give it a go and may even surprise themselves with hidden talents that they never knew they had!! On Friday the relay events take centre stage and are the finale of the carnival. The 4x100m relays are usually the deciding factors in the overall House Champions as they are worth double points and this year was no different. Each house entered teams into all races and the races were fast and hotly contested. The energy in the crowd was electric and this enthusiasm spurred on the runners to run their hearts out and do the best they could for their team and their House. So did the relay events manage to knock Futuna off first position??

And now the big reveal - which House was crowned Overall House Champion?? But before that we need to acknowledge the Age Champions. These students strive to perform to their maximum and participate in all events across the 2-day carnival. They put on display of their outstanding athletic talents and push themselves to perform at the highest level. Congratulations to all Age Champions for this year. The 2017 QISSN (QLD Independent Secondary Schools Netball) Carnival was held in Brisbane from June 25 - June 30 at the Boondall Sports Centre. The Chanel College QISSN team of 2017 have had the most successful QISSN carnival by a Chanel team. This year saw the competition increase in size from 48 schools up to 60 schools and meant that each of the 6 pools had 10 teams in each. With the increase in the number of teams comes an increase in the number of games each school play and for the first time in QISSN, no rest day would be had. The pools were also a mix of teams from higher ranked schools with a mix of teams pushed up in divisions, as was the case with our Chanel team. But none of this mattered to the group of 10 very determined, enthusiastic and talented Chanel QISSN girls. Playing in Brisbane on the first week of the June/July

holidays, the 10 girls played outstanding netball for the whole 5 days of the carnival. Playing an amazing 11 games without a rest day, the team kept up the speed, defence and teamwork to produce Chanel's best ever QISSN result – 9<sup>th</sup> in Division 3 and an outstanding 29<sup>th</sup> out of 60 schools. 5 girls played in their first QISSN carnival (Jaime Holzberger, Hannah Overend, Alexa Campbell, Imogen Collins and Grace Graham) but you would not have guessed this as you watched the games, as these 5 'rookies' came onto the court seamlessly and did not miss a beat. Led on court by Captain Yasmin Ramsay, the Chanel team had a shaky start, but proved to themselves and the rest of the competition that they were here and meant business by beating their next 2 opponents who had gone undefeated up until they played Chanel. This was the confidence boost the team and the new players needed because a change was evident in the team's attitude and attacking play improved from that point forward. On Tuesday the team played 3 games and had some close results and a good win. Their reward for a great start to the carnival was a trip to the movies to see 'Wonder Woman' which was put on by the support given to the carnival by the 'Women in Defence'. Instead of a rest day on the Wednesday, the girls were asked to play 2 more games. The results from these games gave the team a 5th position in the pool and

meant they would be playing off in Division 3

for the very first time in the finals.



fantastic result really spurred the girls on, knowing they would go down as the most successful Chanel QISSN team and they were determined to finish in the top half of the competition. A spot of shopping on the Wednesday afternoon was a good break away from netball and gave the girls a chance to switch off in preparation for the finals. We were drawn to play St Michael's in the elimination final on Thursday, a team that usually sits in Div2/3 in past QISSN carnivals. The girls started off really strong and fast and the game was even up until the half time break. In the second half, St Michaels upped the ante and got some very favourable calls which took the game away from the Chanel girls. Not even some outstanding intercepts from Yasmin and Grace were enough to close the margin. The result was enough to knock us out of the Thursday finals and meant a playoff for 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> on Friday. The team had a good de-brief after the game, and even though they were disappointed with their efforts, they wanted to end the carnival on a high and reward themselves for all the hard work they had put in since the beginning of the year. And that they certainly did! The final on Friday was probably the best game of netball this team has played together - and as the saying goes, they did 'save the best for the last' game. Again calls were going against the team, but their unrelenting defence pressure caused the St Margaret's team to throw intercept passes and they could not handle the speed of ball release on display between the Chanel mid-court and shooters. Things got tight towards the end of the game, but again the leadership of captain Yasmin was the calming influence the younger players needed to keep their heads, keep possession of the ball and come away with the win. Congratulations to the 10 girls in the team - it was a pleasure to watch you play outstanding netball for 5 days. The improvement in your play was fantastic to see and you should all be very proud of the way you played, the teamwork you all displayed and the enthusiasm that was evident every time you stepped onto the court.

Thank you to the parents, families, friends and supporters who came down to Brisbane to watch the girls. We were very lucky to have the support of all 9 families who came to the carnival. Your support at the games and off the court was amazing.

Thank you to Mrs Kerrie Lisle (Manager) and Mrs Beth McAlister (Scorer) for giving up the first week of your holidays to assist me with taking the girls to QISSN. You were both a great help in the lead-up to the carnival and throughout the whole week. We had a lot of fun and from myself and the girls thank you.

Congratulations to Grace Graham who was named Chanel team MVP for the carnival. This is awarded to 1 player from each team and is voted for by your team coach/manager and the opposing team. Grace, playing in her first QISSN carnival, was a tower of strength in defence pulling off vital intercepts and rebounds and driving the ball down the court in the transition from defence into attack. Congratulations Grace.

Congratulations to the QISSN team on an outstanding 2017 QISSN campaign. I look forward to the future of Netball at Chanel. Bring on QISSN 2018 in Townsville!
