UN International Day of Peace ~ 21 September

Each year the International Day of Peace is observed around the world on 21 September. The UN General Assembly has declared this as a day devoted to strengthening the ideals of peace, both within and among all nations and people.

This year's theme is "Together for Peace: Respect, Safety and Dignity for All" and honours the spirit of TOGETHER, a global initiative that promotes respect, safety and dignity for everyone forced to flee their homes in search of a better life. United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres said, "In times of insecurity, communities that look different become convenient scapegoats. We must resist cynical efforts to divide communities and portray neighbours as 'the other'. Discrimination diminishes us all. It prevents people — and societies — from achieving their full potential. Together, let us stand up against bigotry and for human rights. Together, let us build bridges. Together, let us transform fear into hope."

This year, the International Day of Peace focuses on engaging and mobilizing people throughout the world to show support for refugees and migrants. The Day will highlight solidarity with refugees and migrants and showcase the shared benefits of migration to economies and nations, while also acknowledging legitimate concerns of host communities. Ultimately, it will be about bringing people together and reminding them of their common humanity.

Young people will have a vital role to play. For example, they can volunteer to welcome and help refugees and migrants in their communities. They can also extend the hand of friendship to young refugees and migrants who they might meet in their classrooms and neighbourhoods. Did you know?

Australians use between 13-14 billion drink containers a year. BUT less than half of all these containers are collected for re-manufacture. Meaning, seven billion drink containers end up as waste in landfill, littering our beaches and streets, or in our oceans.

Week 10 saw Chanel College celebrate the environment for Enviro week.

Students participated in a number of events throughout the week, to help raise awareness of the impacts we have on our environment.

The week of events started on Tuesday, where during Period 3 all members of the College turned off the power for Earth Hour. Earth Hour is a fantastic way to raise awareness of our dependency on electricity. By reducing energy use in our home and schools we not only save money, but we also increase our energy security, and reduce the pollution that is emitted from non-renewable sources of energy. On Wednesday all Pastoral Care Groups put their brains to the test to see which PC group knew the most about our environment with an online Enviro Quiz. Questions such as; How much of the Earth's Original Forests have been cleared? A 90% B 50% C 80% D 25% (Answer C 80%) were asked and McKillop 5 proved they know all when it comes to our environment winning the quiz with a perfect score. It was then onto Friday's events, and Chanel College's first ever NUDEFOOD day. Students were asked to pack a lunch box which would produce no waste. A conversation could change a life.

R U Ok? Day aims to "inspire and empower everyone to meaningfully connect with people around them and support anyone struggling with life."

RUOk? Day Goals:

- 1. Boost our confidence to meaningfully connect and ask about life's ups and downs
- 2. Nurture our sense of responsibility to regularly connect and support others
- 3. Strengthen our sense of belonging because we know people are there for us
- 4. Be relevant, strong and dynamic

By encouraging each other to meaningfully ask "are you ok?" and by listening to a person's response, we are building connection and a sense of belonging, whilst helping those who may be struggling with life. By asking this simple question and starting a conversation, you could be helping a family member, friend, neighbour or workmate open up. If they respond with "no, I'm not ok", you can use the conversation flow chart in this newsletter to help guide your conversation to support them by finding helpful strategies or seeking professional help.

This year, Chanel College has taken part in R U Ok? Day once again with a range of activities:

- Discussions in morning Pastoral Care about how to ask someone "are you ok?", where to seek help and strategies for self-care
- · Creating a poster at lunch time with creative and alternative ways of asking "are you ok?"
- · Making a pledge to ask someone "are you ok?"
- · Staff morning tea




