20 JUNE – World Refugee Day And Refugee Week

The Refugee Council of Australia has chosen "With courage let us all combine" as the theme for Refugee Week in Australia for 2015 to 2017. Taken from the second verse of the national anthem, the theme celebrates the courage of refugees and of people who speak out against persecution and injustice. It serves as a call for unity and for positive action, encouraging Australians to improve our nation's welcome for refugees and to acknowledge the skills and energy refugees bring to their new home.

Refugee week is an annual week-long celebration of the positive contributions of refugees to Australian society and gives the opportunity to reflect on and respect the bravery, power and strength of mind of women, men and children who are required to flee their mother country under danger of discrimination, clash and aggression. There are almost 40 million people on the earth who have been expatriated from their homes due to hostility and maltreatment, and this number will increase due to increasingly complex issues, such as the strain on civilizations and economies from in climate change. Roughly a third of refugees are people who have run away from their nations because of civil wars and racial, ancestral and religious brutality. They were forced to escape, they have lost everything and they can't revisit their home nation. On the other hand, many of them refuse to give up hope. Commemorating their bravery and determination and allowing them to see our support is what World Refugee Day is all about.

2017 DATA COLLECTION

Dear Parents and Carers

This letter has been sent to all parents and carers of students in our school to inform them of our participation in the 2017 data collection.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on Students with Disability

All schools in Australia are required to participate in the 2017 Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability.

What is the National Collection of Data on School Students with Disability?

All Australian governments have agreed to work together to implement a new annual national data collection on school students with disability. This data collection process was phased in over a three year period from 2013-2015. The first two years were a transition period.

In 2015, the first full national collection of data on school students with disability occurred in all Australian schools. From then on, this data collection will occur in every school, every year, along with other school data collections.

What does disability mean?

This national data collection will reinforce the actions required of schools under the National Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005. The significant change with this collection is the use of a broader definition of disability than the one currently used to identify and allocate resources in educational systems. As a result of this shift in the definition we believe that more students in our community may be considered eligible for identification in the data collection. These laws mean that schools and education systems are required to make, where needed, reasonable adjustments for students with disability.

What is an adjustment?

An adjustment is a measure or action taken to assist a student with disability to participate in education on the same basis as other students. Adjustments can be made across the whole school setting, in the classroom and at the individual level. Some students with disability, at particular stages during their time at school, may not require any personalised adjustments beyond the differentiation that teachers provide to all students on a day-to-day basis.

Differentiation occurs when teachers use a variety of teaching strategies to cater for reasonable adjustments for students with disability. Differentiation is not the same as personalised adjustments made for individual students. Differentiation is part of good teaching practice.

What will this mean for my child?

Determining the level and type of support needed for an individual student is not a new activity for Australian schools. The information provided by this new data collection will enable all Australian governments to better target support and resources to assist students with disability in both government and non-government schools. More accurate information about school students with disability will assist teachers, principals and education authorities to support access and participation in schooling for students with disability on the same basis as students without disability.

What information will be collected?

In 2017 the data collected will include:

- Total number of school students
- Number of students with disability by school level enrolment (primary/secondary)
- Number of students within disability type (physical, social/emotional, cognitive or sensory)

• Level of adjustment provided (Support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive)

Information will be recorded in such a way to be sure that no child can be identified. Student names will not be collected by the Diocesan Catholic Education Office.



Important information for means-tested Australian government Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card holders

In 2017 Catholic Education will introduce a new school fee discount to further support families in our schools. Our policy on school fees states that, no student should be excluded from a Catholic school because of the inability of their parents/carers/guardians to pay the prescribed fees.

From Term One 2017, parents/carers with an eligible means-tested Australian government health care or pensioner concession card will automatically receive a 70% discount on tuition fees (does not apply to school levies). This initiative is intended to assist those families who genuinely lack the financial capacity to pay tuition fees in full.

What if we dont have a Health Care or Pensioner Card?


Families who are experiencing financial hardship, and may or may not hold a concession card, are encouraged to discuss alternate fee discounts directly with the school principal, who will treat the situation confidentially.

Levies vary from school to school and may include items such as a Building Levy, Parents' & Friends' Association Levy, Information Technology Levy, and other subject and general levies. The new Concession Card Discount applies to tuition fees only.

Catholic Education strives to keep all fees as low as possible. The new Concession Card Discount initiative will be offered in addition to the Family Discount arrangement that presently exists in schools.

Furthermore, new or existing parents, who are experiencing financial hardship, and may or may not hold a concession card, are encouraged to discuss alternate fee discounts directly with the school principal, who will treat the situation confidentially.
