
### Planning for 2018

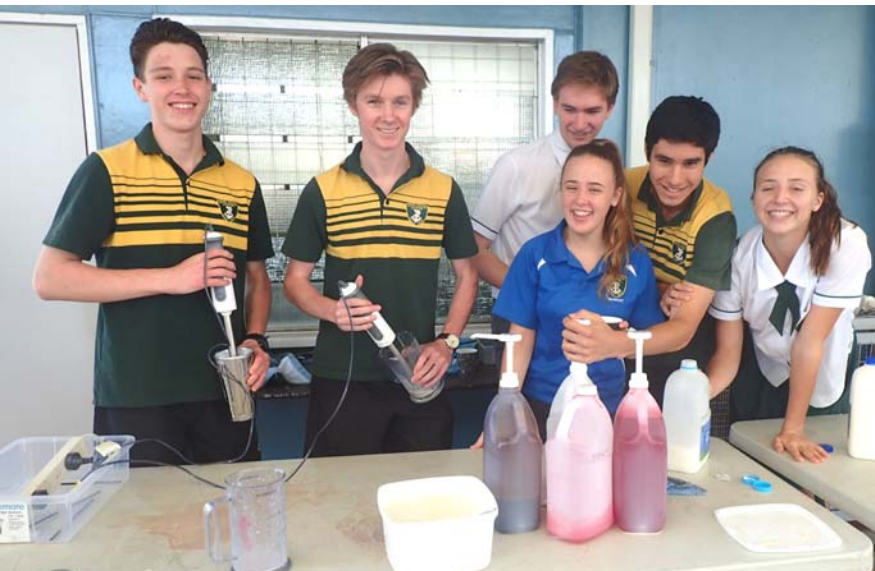

At the beginning of term 3 the year 11 biology students attended a four day field study camp at Eurimbula National Park. Not only was the research conducted interesting, but the company enjoyable and the experience second to none. The location of Eurimbula was idyllic and beautiful, situated between 1770 and Bustard Head the beaches are some of the most gorgeous most of the campers admitted, they had ever seen.

The highlights of the trip included, the transects in which the ecosystems of the area were explored, afternoons and the beach and free time, the Eurimbula cup quiz night on the final evening and last but certainly not least the LARK tour. All campers said that the LARK tour was definitely the highlight of their trip, being able to speak to local experts on the area's history and biological diversity and view some of the area's species up close including four breaching Blue Whales. The tour of the Bustard Head Lighthouse was also one not to be missed, with the vast history giving the students and teachers insight to the plight of lighthouse keepers and their families.

The Eurimbula trip stands as a long lasting College tradition, treasured by all students with the opportunity to attend and the 2017 Biology camp was one that did not disappoint.

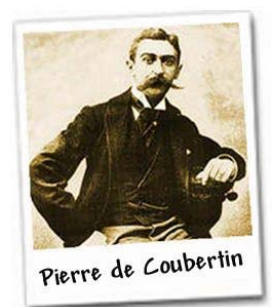
## PIERRE DE COUBERTIN AWARD
