From the Principal

Yesterday we celebrated Ash Wednesday with House Liturgies, where members of our community received ashes on their forehead. I can remember a situation several years ago when I had a dentist appointment after school on Ash Wednesday. As I was sitting in the chair the dentist's assistant started to rub my forehead explaining to me that I had "dirt" on it. I simply replied - "it is OK, it's only ashes". The assistant looked at me a little confused, so with a mouthful of dental instruments, I tried to explain that I was a Catholic and the significance of the ashes.

Ash Wednesday begins Lent, a time when we stop and assess how we are doing in our walk with God. Lent helps us identify spiritual areas in which we can grow and sinful areas that we need to avoid. To repent, put simply, means to turn away from sin and turn toward God. We receive ashes on our forehead in the sign of the cross as an outward expression of our need to begin again.

Each Lenten season, the Chanel community supports Project Compassion, which is Caritas annual fundraising and community engagement appeal. Project Compassion 2015 focuses on Food for Life. It throws a spotlight on global food issues and how Caritas Australia is empowering the world's poorest people to establish sustainable food sources for life. Please give generously!

The recall is due to a potential Hepatitis A contamination. The recall involves a variety of frozen berry products under the product names of Nanna's and Creative Gourmet

Catholic Education Diocese of Rockhampton schools and services have removed any of the recalled products as advised by Food Standards Australia.



## Mathematics Learning Area Linda Rippingale Mathematics Curriculum Leader

Welcome to the 2015 school year. I trust all are well rested and are now ready to settle into an academic year where each and every student works to the very best of their ability. Speaking of working to the best of ones ability, I simply have to congratulate our Year 12 students of 2014. The results achieved by this group of students was outstanding. This surely reflects their natural ability combined with their embracing the opportunities that Chanel College provided for them over the five years of their education.

So back to 2015, many parents ask me what they can do to assist their students in Mathematics. Possibly one of the most important things to do is to promote Mathematics positively by encouraging them to do their best. Of course there are specific things that you can do as well:



Check what your student is doing for homework. There is always homework even if it is revising what was learnt in the last lesson.

Ensuring that they have all the required equipment. It is very difficult for a student to fully participate and get the most out of a lesson if a piece of equipment (text, module, ruler, calculator,pencil, pens, and chromebook) is not available for use.

Encouraging them to do extension work and not be happy with just doing a minimum.

Now for a bit of general information. The expectation is that Middle School Student do about 20 minutes homework for each lesson. That is for Mathematics, 80 minutes per week. Senior School Students would need to do at least 30 minutes per lesson.

Years 7 - 9 use the Pearson Mathematics textbook. Year 9 students have their logins to access Pearson Places (from last year). If they have forgotten it, they can see me or their Mathematics teacher. Years 7, 8 and new Year 9 students will receive their logins as soon as they arrive from Pearsons. Pearson Places has lots of activities and an electronic copy of the textbook. (Saves carrying the textbook home for homework.)
