From the Principal

Feast of St Joseph

Today is the feast day of St Joseph, the Husband of Mary. As a primary school student I attended St Peter's at Caboolture where I was taught by the Josephite nuns, the order established by St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and Reverend Julian E Tenison Woods. The feast day of St Joseph was always celebrated in my school, just as we celebrate our own House feast days throughout the year here at Chanel.

"Saint Joseph is a man of great spirit. He is great in faith, not because he speaks his own words, but above all because he listens to the words of the Living God. He listens in silence. And his heart ceaselessly perseveres in the readiness to accept the Truth contained in the word of the Living God," Pope John Paul II had once said.

There is very little about the life of Joseph in Scripture but still, we know that he was the chaste husband of Mary, the foster father of Jesus, a carpenter and a man who was not wealthy. We also know that he came from the royal lineage of King David.

We can see from his actions in scripture that Joseph was a compassionate man, and obedient to the will of God. He also loved Mary and Jesus and wanted to protect and provide for them.

Since Joseph does not appear in Jesus' public life, at his death, or resurrection, many historians believe Joseph had probably died before Jesus entered public ministry.

We are fast approaching our exam period in the College. As parents, you can support them by providing a positive learning space at home, by actively encouraging them to allocate their study time each night so that they are doing the required number of study hours and importantly supporting and encouraging them when they are tired or frustrated. There are some great tips for study on the Student Google Site.

Exam time can be a challenging time for students and supporting, encouraging and monitoring your child is a positive way to help them cope throughout this period. Ensuring that appointments are not made, decreasing of social engagements and decreasing of student work commitments will all assist positively to getting the best possible outcomes.

Exam Timetables

Students will receive their exam timetables this week. Year 7 and 8 will receive a hard copy and Year 9-12 will be able to obtain a copy on the Google Student Site. With the timetable is a list of all the exam requirements.

This is a very important document as it helps students to plan and prepare for their exams. Please ask to see their exam timetable so you can support them with their preparations.

Reminder to read Page 25 of the Student Organiser regarding absences from exams.

If you have an exam in session one and three you must stay at school. You may NOT leave the school grounds. For all exams you must travel directly to school - No going to other venues eg McDonalds or the Mall on the way to or from school.

Reporting

Year 7 and 8 Rotational Reports

One aspect of the curriculum at Chanel College is the Rotational Subjects. Students study these subjects for approximately 6 weeks on a 4 periods per week basis. They study two subjects per rotation. Your child has just completed the first of these rotations.

During this time students develop knowledge and process skills. They are assessed during this time and achievement standards identified. Reporting on the Rotational subjects is separate to reporting on Core subjects and will occur every six weeks. This report provides feedback on student progress and learning behaviour in the rotational subjects.

We will be emailing [or mailing if you have no email] these Middle Years Rotational Reports every six weeks.

Year 7-12 Reports

At the beginning of Term 2, Progress Reports will be mailed home to parents. These reports will provide information on how well your child is progressing in their subjects. It's main focus will be on Learning Behaviours and how they are developing in your child. More specific information can be obtained from an interview with your child's teacher on the 28 and 29 April.

From the Mathematics Learning Area Linda Rippingale Mathematics Curriculum Leader

As it is now Week 8, and Week 9 is exams, this is a timely reminder that all students need a calculator for the Mathematics exam regardless of the year level. Unfortunately we have very few spares in the Mathematics Department, so we are generally not able to lend calculators. There are several items that are on the booklists that it is assumed students will also bring to exams. These include: a ruler, HB pencil, eraser, sharpener, red biro and a black or blue biro. It is to be hoped that all students are engaged in some revision at this time. Check with your teacher if you are not sure of the topics that are included in the exam.



CAR PARK TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

With the increased enrolment numbers there is more traffic entering the College grounds in the afternoons. Traffic is generally cleared by 3.30 pm, but delaying your pick up will allow you faster access to the College.

For the safety of all of our children could you please adhere to the following management plan. Either side of the traffic island as you enter St Peter Chanel Drive is divided into two lanes. The inside lane, closest to the traffic island, is a clearway for people to exit once they have collected their children. The outside lane, closest to the office, is the designated "pick up" zone. Please remind your


children not to cross St Peter Chanel Drive to access their vehicle. The only point where the road is to be crossed is at the pedestrian crossing.

The head of the queue for picking up students is on the Dawson Highway side of the traffic island. Those parents parking in the pick up lanes are requested to move around to the other side when the queue advances or if space is available.

Inter-House Cross Country

Wednesday 1 April is the day for the Inter-House Cross Country. It will be held in Week 10 at Lions Park (behind Coles/McDonalds and opposite the Gladstone Golf Course). All students will participate by running, walking or assisting with timekeeping for the event. A map of the course and course time records can be found in each Pastoral Care room, on the notice board outside the Tuckshop and on the 'Sports Page' on the student Google site. Students will attend Period 1-3 classes as per normal and will then meet in their designated House areas at the beginning of Period 4 to walk over to Lions Park. College House uniform is to be worn on the day along with College wide-brim hat and water bottle. Sunscreen will be provided for all students. Those students who will be running the course, are allowed to wear running shorts, visor and running shoes. Stella Maris House are the Champions from 2014 and will be out to retain their title.

Period 1-3Classes as per usual. Food will only be available from the Tuckshop first break.12.20 pmShort 10 Minute Break-students return books, go to toilet, get a drink, fill water bottles up, put

running shoes on/change shorts, get hat or cap. Drinks only will be available from the tuckshop.

12.30 pm Students and staff move quickly to House areas:1.00 pm Final Instructions, Warm Up and Marshalling

Two minute gap between races, starting with the Opens.

1.10 pm Start: Open Boys and Girls
