

## **2015 QLD Youth Surf Lifesaving Championships**

Six of our Chanel College Community travelled to Maroochydore on the weekend 20-22 March to participate in the Qld Youth Surf Lifesaving Championships. This is the pinnacle event of the season and the competition is tough, with 49 clubs from across Queensland competing. Tannum Sands SLSC walked away with some amazing results and six medals, two of which were won by our own Sidney Blake (Bronze – U15 Female Beach Flags) and Sophie Duff (Silver – U12 Girls Beach Relay). Most events have heats, quarters, semis and finals. This means they may do each event up to four times, with many of the participants competing in up to 11 events over the three days of competition.

Individual Events - board, surf swim, ironman (board, swim and run), sprints, beach flags and a 1 or 2 km beach run

Team events – surf teams, board relay, cameron relay (board, run and swim, by three separate individuals) and beach relays; in age groups and an all age relay (fastest boy and girl competitor from each age group).

Tough stuff! Nearly all of our students made it to a final for at least one event. The Chanel community would like to recognise and congratulate Joseph and Michael Poli, Mitchell Haig, Sidney and Lachlan Blake and Sophie Duff for the champion effort they put into participating in this carnival.



Dear Parents, Care-givers, Friends and Supporters of Catholic Education

As you might be aware, the *Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse* will conduct a Public Hearing into St Joseph's Home, Neerkol commencing on Tuesday 14 April. The Public Hearing will be in Rockhampton and is expected to last for two weeks. St Joseph's Home at Neerkol was a former orphanage near Rockhampton which was run by the Sisters of Mercy from 1885 until 1978.

I am very supportive of the work of the Royal Commission but I understand that the Public Hearing may be distressing for many people, particularly for those who will be telling the Royal Commission of the abuse they suffered. It is important that we keep all involved in the Public Hearing in our thoughts and prayers.

Discussing child sexual abuse can be difficult. For many, recalling events of the past can bring back painful memories, particularly for those telling their story for the first time. The Royal Commission can refer survivors of child sexual abuse to counsellors or special support groups. Their website (<a href="https://www.childabuseroyalcommission.gov.au">www.childabuseroyalcommission.gov.au</a>) provides a number of links to independent counsellors and special support groups. You can also call the Royal Commission Support Line on 1800 099 340 or the Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton contact person on 1800 830 113.

I am mindful that parents may be upset by evidence given during the Public Hearing. Should you feel the need to speak with anyone, please contact your school Principal who can assist with arranging support or counselling.

I realise the Public Hearing may focus attention on the safety of children today in Catholic schools. As the Director of Catholic Education in the Diocese of Rockhampton, I assure you that my highest priority is the safety of the children in our schools. I believe that we have in place best practice Student Protection Processes that are clear and stringent. I can reassure you that all personnel working in Catholic Education in this Diocese must participate in compulsory, regular student protection training to ensure they fully understand our Student Protection Processes and comply with them.
