On Friday 15 April, Chanel College had the pleasure of hosting a visit by Bruce and Denise Morcombe who tirelessly promote the Daniel Morcombe Foundation as Child Safety Ambassadors for Queensland.

Bruce and Denise spoke with our Year 7 and 8 Students, teaching them the essential behaviours of 'Recognize, React and Report' educating how to stay safe in a physical and online environment.

RECOGNIZE: Our bodies tell us when we don't feel safe through our **BODY CLUES**. Such as butterflies in your tummy, heart pounding, sweaty palms etc.

REACT: If you feel scared, confused, sad or upset you need to **REACT**. This could even mean breaking a rule, like screaming "NO" to an adult. It's ok to say "NO" if you feel unsafe or unsure. **REACT** by getting away from the danger. Remember to Run to a safe location if you feel unsafe.

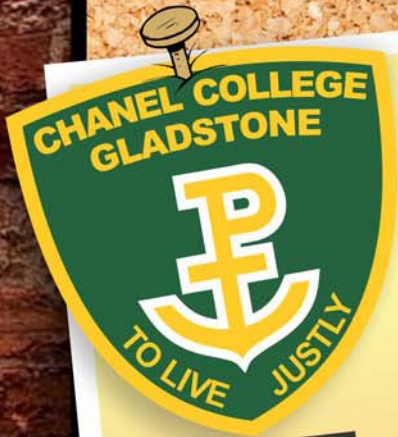
REPORT: This means telling an adult in your life who cares about your safety when there is a problem. Create a Safety Network of Adults and Organisations who you know will, **LISTEN TO YOU, BELIEVE YOU AND HELP YOU**. This can be Mum or Dad, School Teacher, Grandparents, Auntie or Uncle.

REMEMBER, if you are not getting the help you need, keep trying until you do!

2016 Structured Workplace Learning and Work Experience - Fee Structure and Payment Procedure

As of 2016, EQIP will be placing all of our Chanel College students in Work Experience, or Structured Workplace Learning. The cost of each placement is \$60, and must be paid on submission of the application form to the front office. Payment will be accepted either by cash or credit card.

In order to guarantee your first preference, a self-placement is strongly encouraged. You may speak with the Careers Officer about how to achieve this. You will be advised to approach interacting with a host employer as if you were applying for a job, so always be well presented and prepared, and remember that you are representing Chanel College at all times.

Form literacy is important. Application forms will be returned to you if they are not completed in full, this includes ALL sections on the form, including all relevant signatures. You must write clearly and legibly. All application forms MUST be submitted before the application date, and **NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED**.

Once students have received their Work Experience Pack, all three coloured copies of the contract must be signed by the student; parents/guardians; host employer, then returned to the College for Ms Volp to sign. Only then is the Work Experience placement covered by insurance.

Year 10 Structured Workplace Learning

The Year 10 Structured Workplace Learning forms have been released. It is vital that you follow ALL instructions, and return your forms in a timely fashion, with forms being due back to Mrs Gardiner in the Careers Office by **Friday 27 May (End of week 7)**. **Late applications will not be accepted.**

Year 11 and 12 VET Structured Workplace Learning

All Year 11 and 12 students studying Certificate 1 Engineering, Certificate 2 Business, and Certificate 2 Hospitality, will be receiving their Structured Work Experience application forms this week. Applications forms must be returned with payment to the front office **NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 13 MAY (End of week 5)**. This Structured Work Placements forms part of the assessment of these courses, therefore is compulsory.

Holiday Vocational Placements

Holiday Vocational Placement applications will be available for collection from the outside of the Careers Office from Tuesday 26 April. These applications, along with payment are due to the front office **NO LATER THAN FRIDAY 13 MAY (End of Week 5)**.

Students on the Vocational Learning Pathway Program (1 day per week placement)

Students wishing to participate in this program must have an appointment with Mrs Gardiner and their parents before this can be arranged. Students currently participating in this program must have their new application forms returned by Friday May 27 in order to secure a placement for Term 3.

DUE DATE for application forms and payment – **Friday 27 May (End of Week 7)** for placement in Term 3.
