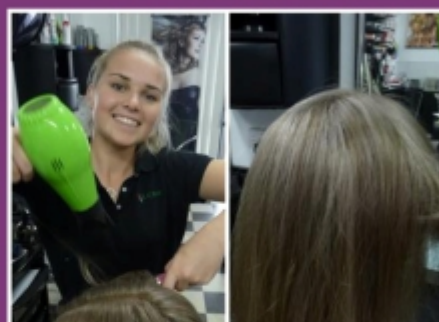
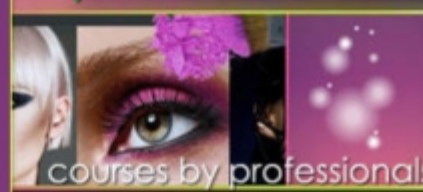
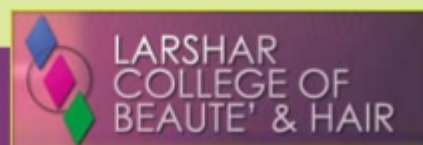
Year 9 Career Day

YEAR 10 & 11 STUDENTS ONLY PLEASE NOTE:

- When students receive their form they are requested to check their book numbers are correct and if there are any problems students are to see Mrs McAlister immediately.
- Any books **not required for studying** should be returned from **Monday 14 November**.

During Exam week:

- It is the **responsibility** of the **individual student** to make sure he/she returns their **Text and Class Set Books** to the Bookhire Room **after each exam is finished**.
- **ALL** outstanding/damaged books must be returned or paid for by **FRIDAY 25 NOVEMBER**. The cost of each book can be found on the list which is given to students.

YEAR 7, 8 & 9 STUDENTS PLEASE NOTE:

- When students receive their form they are requested to check their book numbers are correct and if there are any problems students are to see Mrs McAlister immediately.
- Year 7, 8 & 9 students are required to return the Text and Class set Books during the last week of school. These books need to be returned by **THURSDAY 1 DECEMBER** and outstanding/damaged books must be paid for by **FRIDAY 2**. The cost of books can be found on the list which is given to students.

PLEASE NOTE: It is not good enough to simply return a book. It is important that students **return the correct numbered book** which was issued to the student originally. If a student returns another student's book, the book will be marked off against the correct student's name.

If students have books in their possession that are not listed on the list given to them please return them as it may belong to another student.

Letters requesting payment for outstanding/damaged books will be forwarded to parents with the Academic Reports.
