Parenting 10 e 45 INSIGHTS

Building parent-school partnerships

Making a smooth start to secondary school

Getting used to new subjects and new teachers, as well as forming new friendships, are just some of the requirements of this transition.

Starting secondary school is a time of change and uncertainty, which places new demands on young people. Being at the bottom of the pecking order where they are unsure of the playground hierarchies is just one adjustment that they need to make.

Some kids take these new experiences in their stride but it is natural to experience some difficulty, particularly when it's accompanied by the potentially unsettling transition from childhood to adolescence. It's no coincidence that many research projects indicate that children's learning levels out in the transition year, presumably because the social tasks of adjustment take precedence over academic performance.

It helps to remember the Four P's to help your young person settle in:

Promote friendships

The quicker kids form new friendships the sooner they'll feel comfortable in their secondary school surroundings. Encourage your young person to be open to forming friendships with all sorts of kids; to be accepting of others who may be different to them; to take social risks by joining in activities even though they may feel uncomfortable; and to be friendly, approachable and positive!

Practice patience

Patience and understanding in the early weeks is essential. Brush up on your listening skills as you help your young person adjust. Talk to your young person about change and reassure them that it is normal to feel unsure or nervous in new circumstances. Let them know that many difficulties they face will be temporary.

3 Pursue a positive attitude

Confidence is catching so make sure you see this transition time as an exciting challenge that your child can handle rather than an event to be feared. Ask them about the new subjects or interesting activities they are doing, and try to shift their focus to the positive aspects of school. Discuss settling in issues with the appropriate person such as your child's Pastoral Care Teacher or Pastoral Leader, but give your young person time to handle them on their own before seeking help.

4 Process their day

Some young people may come home with fairly exaggerated accounts of secondary school and may not always paint a fair picture. They may become sensitive to things that they might have shrugged off in primary school. Listen without judgment and show a real interest in their new school, while providing

them with the space they need to get away for a while. Expect some behaviour blowouts as many kids let off steam in the relatively safe and stable environment of a loving family.

If your eldest is starting, then secondary school will be a relatively new experience for you too. It will take some time for you to adjust to the school's culture and communication methods.

Although secondary schools may seem a little foreign for those used to the relative intimacy of primary schools, one aspect is the same – outcomes for students are maximised when schools and parents work together in the best interests of the student.

One way to support your young person's school is by actively promoting the school's values. For instance, if respect is a prominent school value then you can discuss this in relation to the way your young person behaves around friends, relatives and family.

Most importantly, talk up your young person's new school, rather than talk it down, as kids of all ages take their cues from the most significant adults in their lives – their parents!

1. Annual per student funding that keeps pace with the rising costs of education	
 If elected Labor will continue the existing method of providing state funding to Catholic and independent schools through the basket-nexus formula. As the cost of educating a child increases in the state system there will be a commensurate increase in per student funding to the Catholic system. 	 The LNP Government is committed to ensuring all Queensland children receive a first class education, regardless of which sector provides that education. We support parents' right to choose the school they believe will be best for their child and consistent with their personal values or faith. The LNP Government committed to continuing its close engagement with QCEC to ensure that Catholic schools in Queensland have the certainty they will be able to continue to provide Queensland families with an affordable and high quality choice when it comes to education.
2. Increased capital funding to deliver the additional student places required to meet the needs of Queensland's growing population	
 Queensland Labor appreciates that the schools planning process currently underway has widespread support among education stakeholders and we will continue this collaborative process. We also believe there is an appropriate role for government to provide capital grants to the non-state schooling sector for the construction of new schools and upgrades of existing schools. A Labor Government will provide an additional \$37 million (\$25 million for the Catholic School sector) in capital grants for the non-state schooling sector in each of the 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 financial years. 	 The LNP Government supports the right of parents to send their children to a Catholic school and recognises the responsibility of government to provide an appropriate share of capital funding for those schools. The Future Schools Fund will include \$700 million to provide up to 22 new schools across the state, ensuring that we plan properly for a bright future for Queensland kids. A re-elected LNP Government will be informed by the current policy framework for capital funding and other capital contributions to government, Catholic and independent schools on the basis of the recommendations provided to the Government by the Queensland Schools Planning Commission. Proposals for capital funding from any of the three sectors will be considered when the detailed arrangements for the fund are established. The capital funding to be made available under the Future Schools Fund will be an additional investment by a re-elected LNP Government.
3. Support for Students With Disability (SWD)	
 In government, Queensland Labor will examine the possibility of creating teams of specialists to ensure all children in our state, whether they are educated in state, Catholic or independent schools are assessed for disability support and are provided with the help they need. 	 The LNP Government is committed to ensuring that all Queenslanders are provided with the appropriate support to enable them to achieve positive educational outcomes. We are committed to further consultation with QCEC and the independent sector to ensure that students with a disability continue to have access to high quality specialist staff, and are open to providing access, support and advice on a fee for service basis.

Re NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme): We welcome the opportunity to work with QCEC and other key stakeholders in the education sector should we be re-elected.

4. Support for Vocational Education and Training (VET) for secondary school students

- A Labor Government will invest \$34 million to rebuild the Queensland TAFE system.
 In particular we will invest \$5 million over three years to increase the number of courses available through VET in schools.
- With respect to accessibility (to VET) for those living in regional and rural areas, Registered Training Organisations (RTO) will often offer training delivery in a variety of modes and formats and online delivery is accessible for many qualifications.
- In relation to the options available for female students under the Employment Stream
 our VET Investment Plan is reviewed every year and these concerns will be given due
 consideration ahead of the release of the 2015/16 VET Investment Plan.
- QCEC currently receives \$866,200 annually. We are committed to actively reviewing the VET allocation beyond 2015.

5. Parent Engagement Strategies

The Catholic sector is seeking a commitment from the next Queensland Government to:

- work collaboratively to support strategies to enhance parent engagement across all Queensland schools
- provide \$250,000 in funding to enable the Catholic sector to roll out its recently developed framework for parent engagement, including a bank of resources and standards that enable schools to measure their success
- collaboratively devise and support a program of research and planning to further connect schools and playgroups and assist parents with the necessary tools in the vital first three years.
- Queensland Labor is encouraged by the ongoing research and evidence which demonstrates that strategies to involve parents in their children's education have real and lasting benefits.
- We will work with the Catholic sector to design and support parent engagement strategies with an appropriate program of research to analyse the efficacy of particular actions. A Labor Government will make available \$250,000 over three years to the Queensland P&F Association to roll out its parent engagement strategy in Catholic schools.
- The LNP Government welcomes QCEC's desire to work collaboratively to support strategies to enhance parent engagement.
- This includes empowering families and providing opportunities for them to be engaged in their child's learning, and enabling regular and valued two-way communication with parents and communities about children and their school. (We)....look forward to further consultation as we work to finalise the Queensland Education Accord and our shared vision for the future of education in our state.
- With respect to your request for \$250,000 in funding to enable the Catholic sector to roll
 out its new framework for parent engagement, we will be making new policy
 announcements to enhance the LNP's strong plan for Queensland over the remaining
 days of the election campaign.
