At Assembly as a community we participated in a Reconciliation Liturgy led by the students from Stella Maris. Since 1998, a National Sorry Day has been held in our country to remember the sad stories of the removal of thousands of Indigenous children from their families. This day is now called "A Journey of Healing". National Reconciliation Week celebrates the relationship between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders and all other Australians. Every year, the week is held between the same dates, 27 May to 3 June. The dates draw attention to significant historical events. The 27 May marks the day in 1967 when the referendum was passed for the Australian Government to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders and to allow them to be recognised in the census. June 3 marks the day in 1992 that led the Australian Government to recognise native title and acknowledge Indigenous Australians as the original occupants of Australia – the Mambo decision.

In 2014, the theme for National Reconciliation Week is 'Let's Walk the Talk', focusing on turning past conversations into actions.

Work Experience 2014

Forms for the Year 11 and Year 12 Structure Workplace Learning in Tourism, Hospitality, Business and Engineering has closed.

Year 10 Work Experience forms have been coming in quickly. These have been passed onto SAIN for placement. Students need to remember that they need to complete their Safety Sense Certificate and attach it to the form. If they haven't completed it please ask them to go to the site attached to the letter accompanying their preference form.

The holiday Work Experience Agreements from SAIN will be sent to the College next week. The upcoming school holiday applications have closed.

School Based Traineeship

The Traineeship is a Cert 2 Warehousing Operations qualification. The role involves the students in most aspects of the business, receiving and receipting stock, preparing customer orders, computerise stock control, point of sale and selling skills, making and receiving phone calls, assisting with deliveries to plumbers on site, just to name a few.

Students will be required to work a minimum of 100 days (750hrs) over the duration of their Traineeship, there is no maximum. This is achieved mostly by students attending the workplace one day each week during school terms and any extra days approved by the school eg Pupil Free days. This day is normally set by the school as we fit in with the day that has the least impact on the students other subjects/timetable. The students can work additional days in their school holidays but we discourage 40hpw as we promote a healthy school, work and life balance. We also stress the importance of completing school assessments and maintaining the requirements of their other subjects. Students can also work Saturday mornings 8.00 am – 12.00 noon.

The students are paid for every work hour at a starting rate 15-16yoa \$10.50ph. The rate increases at 17yoa and again at 18yoa.


The learning component is conducted in the workplace by the (RTO) Murray Mallee Training Company and Reece in paid time so there is no need for the students to attend another location or college. The competencies are achieved by a combination of Workbook Activities and Practical Assessments conducted by the RTO every 4-6 weeks on the students work days. All the learning outcomes are completed by BOS cut off in September of their year 12 and students normally continue to work with Reece until the **31 Dec** of this year if they wish.

The Reece workplace is modern, safe and clean environment with excellent procedures and policies. The Reece Managers and staff provide great support and encouragement to young people starting out in the work world. In some cases they also become examples of positive role models for many young people in this program.

Successful graduates of the program are encouraged to stay on in F/T jobs at Reece. Many of our graduates who take up F/T roles at Reece have been fast tracked into management positions. Other successful outcomes of the program are still a win/win as the Reece customers get to know the students they are often offered Apprenticeships in Plumbing / Landscaping/Construction as a result of the networking opportunities this traineeship provides the students.
