## Towards the State Election 2015 - Key Issue 1

### Annual per student funding that keeps pace with the rising costs of education

Catholic schools in Queensland, on average, receive only about 81% of the government funding per student received by state schools. According to the latest figures available, Catholic schools, on average, receive \$9,238 per student in government funding while state schools receive \$11,440 per student (MySchool website 2012).

Any additional government funding for Catholic schools helps relieve pressure on school fees and assists more families to choose a Catholic school. This also relieves pressure on state schools and also saves government money. Catholic education is seeking to work with the next Queensland Government to achieve consistent budget outcomes that will:

- assist Catholic schools to keep pace with rising operating costs
- ensure that the gap in resourcing between Catholic schools and state schools does not widen.

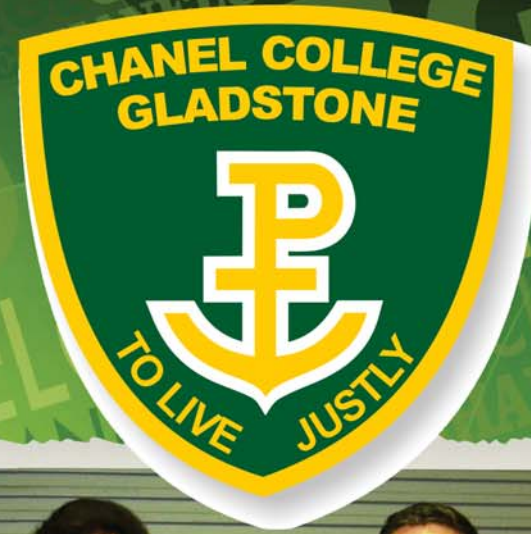

## State Athletics Trials

Over the past weekend (23-26 October) a number of Chanel students travelled down to Brisbane to compete in the State Track and Field Trials. They competed as part of the Capricornia Team, all in with the aim of setting personal bests and qualifying for a place on the QLD Track and Field Team. **Ryan Wright** competed in the Open Boys Shot Put event and achieved an outstanding result of 4<sup>th</sup> overall. **NOTICE TO ALL YEAR 12 PARENTS**

On **Monday 27 October** all Year 12 students were given a list of all books they have on loan from the Bookhire Room. Attached to this list is an instruction sheet regarding what is expected of students during this week and also during Exam Week.

The following points are outlined in this instruction sheet:

- When students receive their list they are requested to check their book numbers are correct and if there are any problems students are to see me immediately.
- Any books **not required for studying** should be returned from **Monday 27 October**. This will help with some of the last minute rush to return books. It certainly would assist Bookhire Staff at this extremely busy time of the year.

**During Exam Week:**

- It is the **responsibility of the individual student** to make sure he/she returns all **outstanding text and class set books** to the Bookhire Room **after each exam is finished**.
- **ALL** outstanding/damaged books must be returned or paid for by **MONDAY 17 NOVEMBER**. Letters requesting payment of outstanding/damaged books will be forwarded to parents. The booklists given to student also indicate the cost of replacing outstanding/damaged books.

**PLEASE NOTE: It is not good enough to simply return a book.** It is important that students **return the correct numbered book** which was originally issued to that student. If a student returns another student's book then the book will automatically scan against the correct student's name.

As exams finish **Friday 14 November** ALL books should be returned by the end of that day. A final list of outstanding books will be placed in rolls on **MONDAY 17 NOVEMBER**. Accounts for outstanding/damaged books will be included in the Exit Statements envelope.

It would be appreciated if parents could encourage students to be diligent with this task at a very busy time of the year so that we can all have a happy ending to the students' final days at Chanel College.
