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Pope Francis – the first pope from the Americas, Time magazine's 'Person of the Year' in 2013, and a nominee for the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014 – continues to be a source of inspiration, for both Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

To the young people who gathered in Krakow, Poland, for World Youth Day in 2016, Pope Francis emphasised the imperative that they should never be afraid to dream big, to aspire, to have ideals, or to use their talents in the service of humankind. Five months later, as 2016 drew to a close, Pope Francis observed in his New Year's Eve statement that within our world today, there is a paradox of "a culture that idolises youth and yet has made no place for the young" (Cited in The Independent, 31 December, 2016). Thus, in order to give young people – the future of our Church – a voice in their Church, Pope Francis made this declaration:

My Dear Young People,

I am pleased to announce that in October 2018 a Synod of Bishops will take place to treat the topic: "Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment." I wanted you to be the centre of attention, because you are in my heart ...

A better world can be built ... as a result of your efforts, your desire to change and your generosity. Do not be afraid to listen to the Spirit who proposes bold choices; do not delay when your conscience asks you to take risks in following the Master. The Church also wishes to listen to your voice, your sensitivities and your faith; even your doubts and your criticism. Make your voice heard and let it resonate in [your] communities ... (Pope Francis, Letter to Young People, 13 January, 2017).

The very inclement weather this week and the cancellation of classes has meant that we have had to defer the celebration of our Easter Liturgy until the beginning of Term 2. Given that the celebration of Easter falls at the end of the holidays, it will be fitting to have our College celebration after we return to school. As an 'Easter people' we will be able to join with Christians the world over and proclaim, Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!

While, in retrospect, the term has gone very quickly, it has also been very busy with study, sport, excursions, assemblies, retreats, Buddies Days, QCS and NAPLAN practices, and the many other activities that seem to fill our College calendar. Thus, as Week Ten draws to a close, there is everywhere a sense that it is indeed time for a holiday! I wish all students and staff a well-earned, restful, refreshing, and safe holiday.





Farewell Gobbleguts

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in Laboratory

Members of MK2, recent and current students may be sad to hear that Gobbleguts, the Biology Laboratory fish, has died after being ill for several weeks. Gobble, as we called him, was with us for around 10 years, which is an extremely long time for a 'Barb', and even longer for a school aquarium fish...an occupation fraught with hazard.

Gobble was sold to me as a male Tiger Barb for my home aquarium, but didn't look or grow like a typical Tiger Barb. I'm pretty certain he was really a female Arulius Barb, which was a

similar, but larger and longer lived species. Even so, 10 years is a very good innings!

Gobbleguts was sentenced to 'solitary' confinement here at school because he kept fin nipping our guppies. So he became a regular feature in our lab, giving a never ending supply of pond weed and water for our microscope pracs. In 2011, he modelled for the production of his own Chemical Safety poster, 'The Gobbleguts guide to Laboratory Hazard & Warning Signs',

which even found it's way to some West Australian schools. Before he died we were working on a GHS update for it, which might yet eventuate. Gobble was always very focussed on helping students with laboratory safety.
