The questions were business-related, covering Accounting, Marketing and Management, Economics and Law, as well as a few General Knowledge questions. Considering the fact that our students do not have exposure to some of these subjects at school, they put in a great effort. All teams were very close by final score time, with only 4 points between the highest and lowest scoring team. Tannum State High ended up taking out the challenge this year and will have the opportunity to enter Round 2 where they will compete with teams from each of the other locations via videoconferencing links. Tannum received a perpetual trophy and \$500 cash prize. Scholarship help is also offered to members of the winning team, provisional upon their enrolment in an undergraduate degree course in Business, Commerce, Economics and Law and/or Management. It's Flu Season

Flu Season Reminder



As you are aware every year Queensland experiences an influenza or flu season. As we enter this season it is timely to remind parents and care-givers not to be complacent about flu.

Flu is a virus more serious than the common cold and can be spread through talking, coughing and sneezing.

Symptoms include sudden fever, dry cough, muscle aches and pains, fatigue, headache, sore throat and a stuffy or runny nose.

If your child has flu-like symptoms, the following is advised:

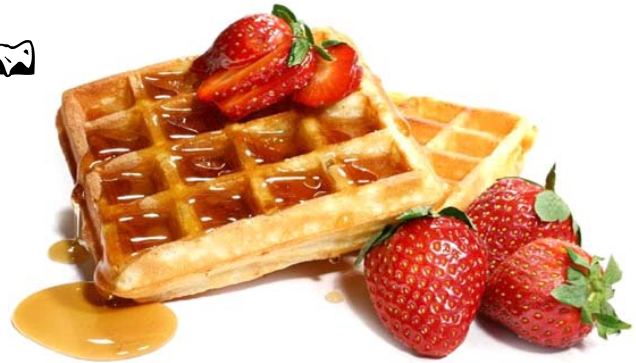
- Keep your child home from school;
- Ensure your child washes their hands regularly with soap and water or sanitiser gel;
- Encourage your children when coughing or sneezing, to cover their mouth and nose with disposable tissues which should be disposed of immediately;
- Ensure your child drinks plenty of fluids and gets lots of rest;
- Consult your doctor if you are concerned about his/her symptoms.

The school requests that anyone displaying flu-like symptoms stay at home until such symptoms have passed. Families should also reinforce the recommended protective actions listed above.

Increased awareness and ongoing attention to prevention and control measures, such as vaccination and good hygiene, are steps that we can all promote to reduce the impact of influenza.

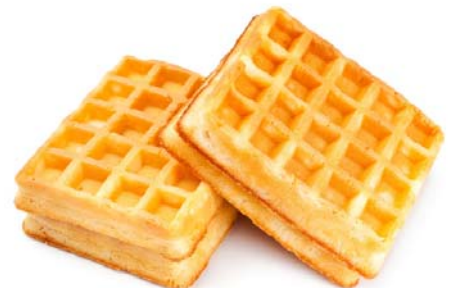
