For eight students and three teachers from Chanel College, Gladstone, life as we usually know it changed over the two weeks of the school holidays. We immersed ourselves in the East Timorese culture through community bonding and volunteering within the humble village of Baguia. Through connecting with numerous people in Baguia, we taught English and games, however they taught us the importance of community, family and the

realisation that materialistic things should not control our attitude towards life. We climbed mountains, played games in an orphanage, cooked dinner over an open fire; taught English in three different schools, sang songs and danced with passion, showered with only a litre of water every night and completely delved into every aspect of the lifestyle of Timor Leste.

Life in a developing country contrasts greatly with the bustling chaos of the Western civilisation. We learnt to live simple lives so that others around us could simply live. Instead of allowing our belongings to matter more than belonging itself, we changed our teenage arrogances and found a common ground between ourselves and the East Timorese: life is short and must be fully lived.

We now have memories that can never be forgotten. This trip has opened our eyes, hearts and souls to the bigger problems within our world. As pieces in the puzzle of life, we as students of Chanel College feel it is vital to make small changes to what needs to be changed. However, before we can enhance the world, we need to enrich ourselves ... and Timor Leste helped us do this, influencing our values and our morals. It's important to grow from each life experience, and Timor Leste provided us with an abundance of life experiences and personal acceptance that did not exist previously.

Our group mutually agreed that working towards the greater things in life - family, humility and love - are the most rewarding gifts we could ever cherish. Our group strongly encourages future seniors to walk in our footsteps and engage in travels that make a difference in this world ... perhaps starting with Timor Leste.




























Introduction to Safety, Industry and Academic Writing

Over the September school holidays Queensland Mineral and Energy Academy (QMEA), Australian Pacific LNG (APLNG), QGC, Santos GLNG and Central

Queensland University (CQU), held a two day course designed for Year 12 students who have an interest in studying Engineering and other STEM pathways at a University level.

Myself (Abi Meehan) and Michael Poli (both Year 11 students), were fortunate enough to join Jack Scanlan, Marc Carino, Max Dooley, Melanie Jose, Lily Wild, Chloe Canilao, Kristin Coates all Year 12 Chanel College students, along with students from other schools for this great opportunity. Melanie from APLNG/ConocoPhillips provided us with the skills required to expand a professional network through managing our brand, alongside how to create an effective resume. We were also provided with an Inspiration Session where Cole Fallon, Ian Gracias, Jesse Lord and Reuben Smith all talked about their current and past experiences studying Engineering at CQU.

Palisa Huoth also took time out from her working day to explain what she does as a consulting engineer, demonstrating the different avenues of where engineering can take you. The final activity on day one was a practical experiment making and then testing the workability of concrete through a series of tests with Ashfaque Chowdhury a lecturer of Mechanical Engineering.

Day two commenced with an introduction to Safety delivered by QGC Health and Safety Superintendent Greg Chrisfield, explaining safety in the workplace and its importance. We then engaged in an academic writing skills session, with Valerie Cleary teaching us tips on studying and collecting information for reports that we can utilise in our first year at University. Our final session consisted of an onsite visit to NRG power plant where we learnt the basics of the plant and how this is run by the engineers.

I personally found the two days an invaluable opportunity and I will now be able to put into place during my Year 12 schooling a lot of what I learnt during this event. I highly recommend any future students taking this path to University to make the time to attend events such as these as the information and knowledge gained can only enhance your understanding of this career path and prepare you better for University.

None of this would have been possible without Tammy Grady and all her hard work and commitment to QMEA, thank you on behalf of all the Chanel College students that attended.
