
Brother John Venard Smith, RIP

On Wednesday morning we received the sad news that Br John Venard Smith, former Principal of Chanel College had died in Brisbane. Br John was Principal of Chanel College from the late 1980s until 1993 and was the last Marist Brother Principal of the College.

He was a well known and loved member of Star of the Sea Parish and the wider Gladstone community. He was living at Marist College Ashgrove at the time of his death – two weeks short of his 90th birthday.

Br John will also be fondly remembered for his "Battler's God" series of reflection books. His funeral will be in the Marist College Chapel, Ashgrove next Wednesday.
