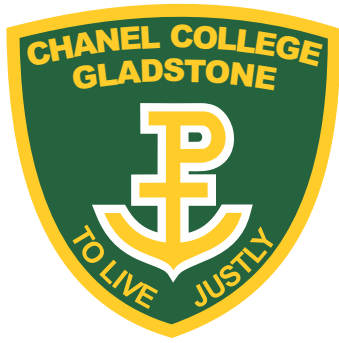

# Hating ALISON ASHLEY

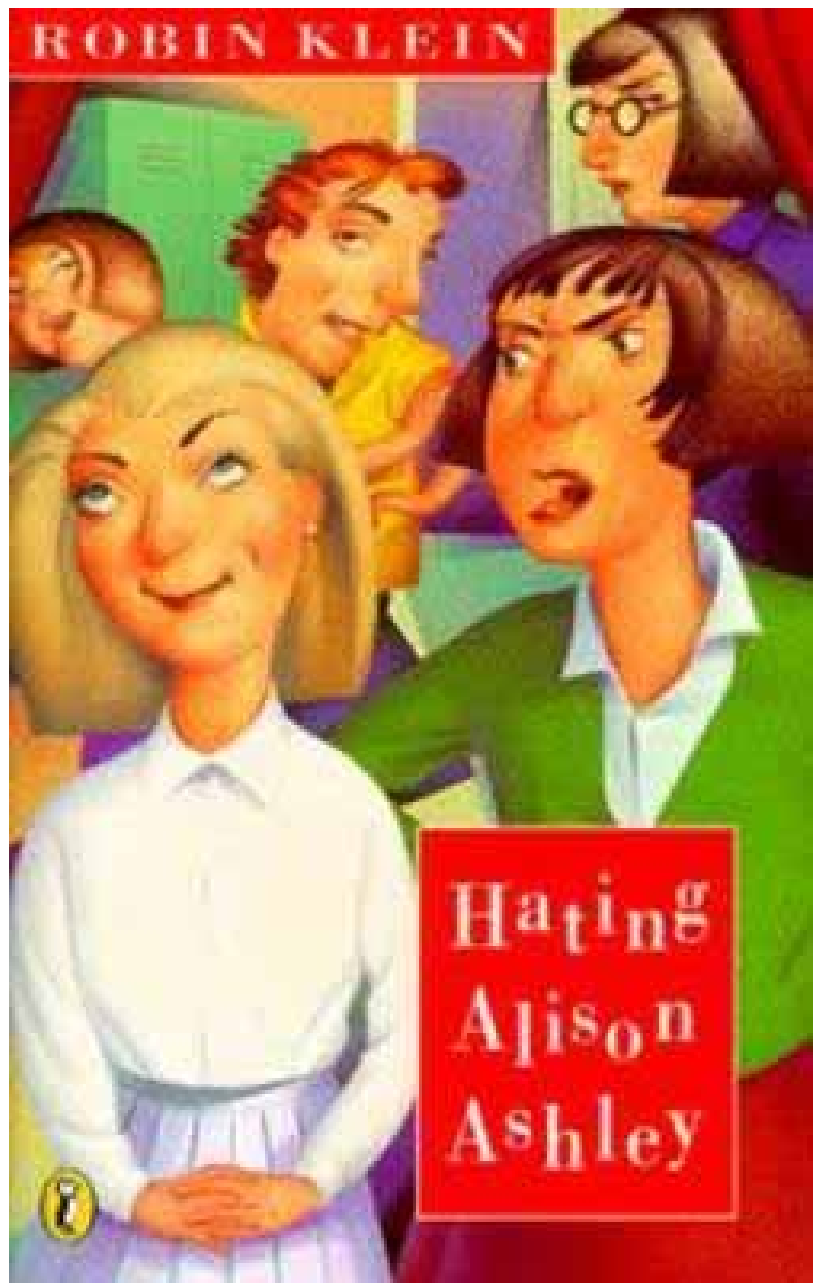
