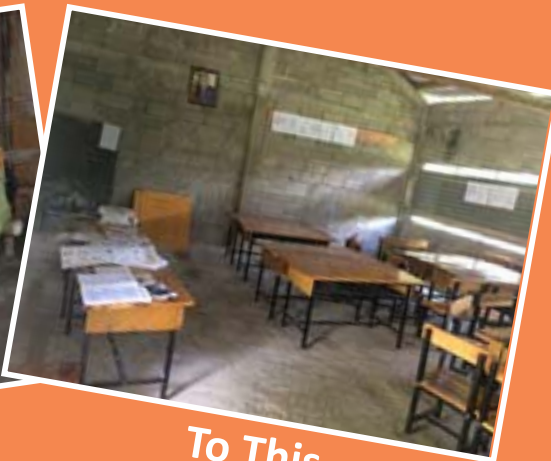

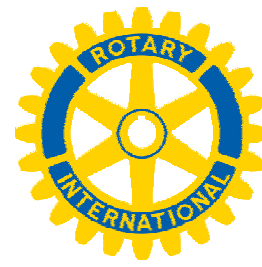
He spoke to the students about both of these roles, and the future of the Tourism industry in Queensland.

The visit was facilitated by the Department, and the students were grateful for all the information he provided, along with some tips on applying for work in the industry.





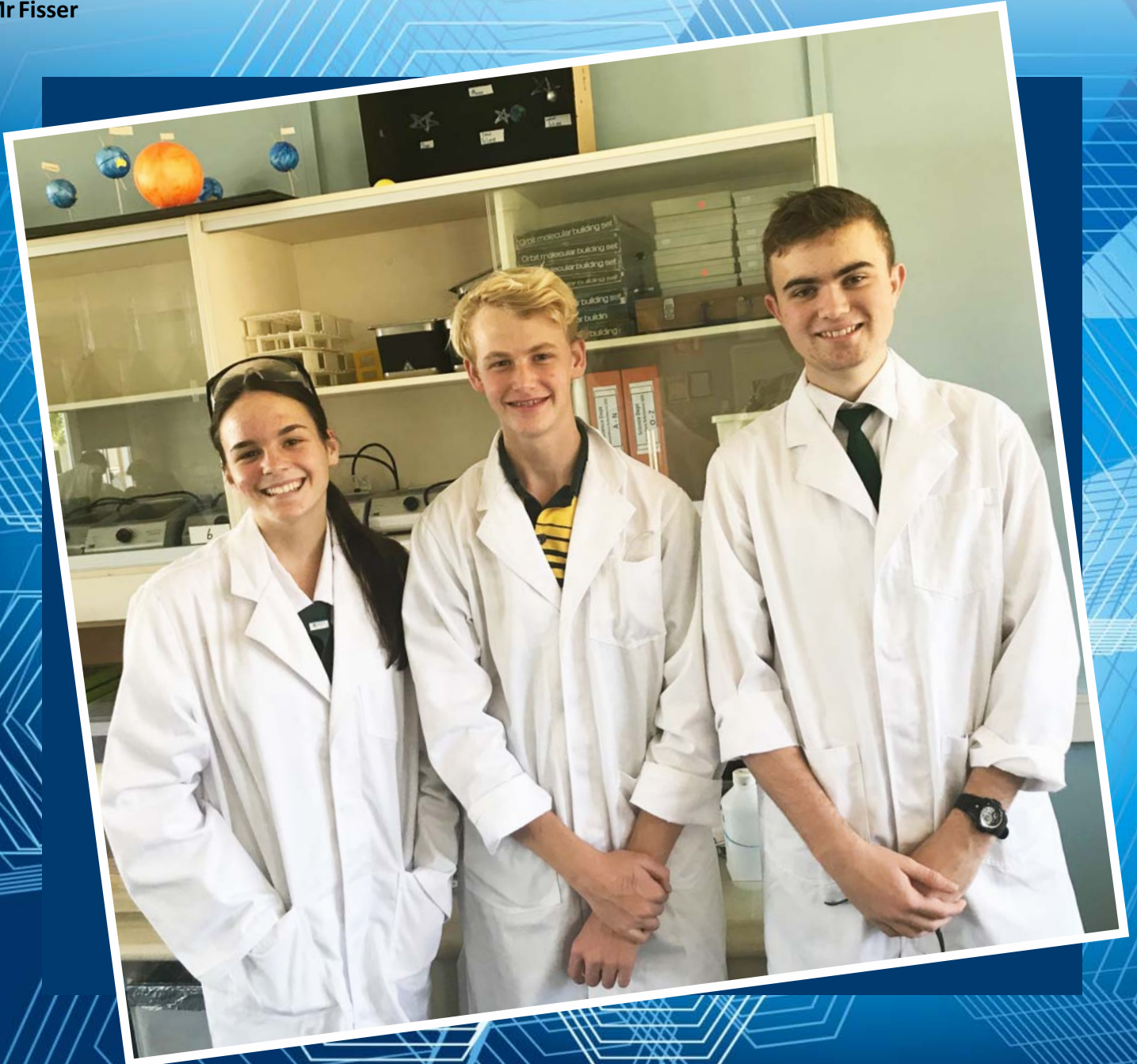

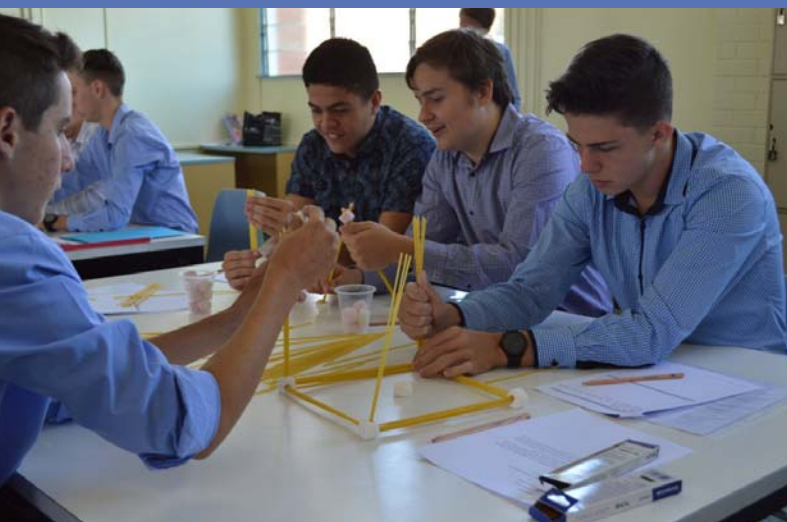
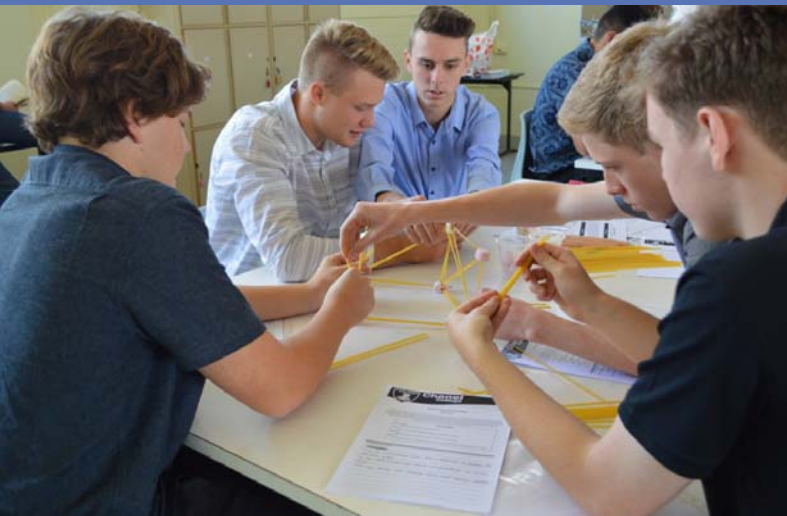
# Mock Interviews
