### FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

#### **Social Justice Sunday**

Each year the Catholic Bishops of Australia issue a major statement for the coming year on Social Justice Sunday (the last Sunday in September). This year's Statement "For Those Who've Come Across the Seas: Justice for refugees and asylum seekers" was developed in response to the longstanding divisions in Australian society over asylum seekers, particularly those who have arrived by sea. The title is taken from the second verse of Australia's National Anthem and reminds us of how our nation has always presented itself as a place of welcome and inclusion. In the light of this, all Australians are urged to reexamine our response to this deepening humanitarian crisis and to demand from our elected leaders a "public debate (that) is characterised by respect for the human dignity of people seeking asylum". The Bishops remind us of the nearly 60 million people around the world who are displaced from their homes and of the war and violence that are devastating countries in the Middle East, Africa and Asia.



Shamrock Civil has been corresponding with Chanel College to keep us up to date regarding the development of the KinKora Roundabout. Please find below their most recent update for your information.

Over the next ten days the main activities on the project site will include:

- Working on the foundations for the two new bus stops on Philip Street
- Starting the concrete footpaths on Philip Street
- Widening the road at the front of McDonalds and on the corner of Philip Street and the Dawson Highway at the Stockland car park
- Ongoing water and sewer pipe installation
- Ongoing storm water pipe installation
- Starting the installation of the underground electrical infrastructure for the traffic signals
- Temporary removal of the small left lane turn into the Windmil Centre – access will remain open for motorists from the other lane

Please continue to encourage pedestrians to cross safely at the Philip Street signalised pedestrian crossing during the closure of the other crossing.

Did you know when the intersection upgrade is complete there will be three signalised pedestrian crossings?

Once again thank you for your ongoing patience and support as we construct this important piece of infrastructure.
