

Mathematics

Some parents may have noticed the addition of an A5 notebook on the booklist for Mathematics. One thing I want to strongly encourage across all Mathematics classes is the use of a summary book. Students should add to the book each night they have a lesson, with the important concepts that they learnt in class, and maybe some examples they can review. At the end of each week they will be able to review the notes in their summary book, meaning they will be continually revising throughout the term (so the work in Week 1 will be reviewed at least 8 times before the exam, Week 2 will be reviewed 7 times, etc). As exams each term will be cumulative (have material from previous terms), this technique is also very valuable for long term learning. Regular revision has been shown to improve memory, which is extremely important for exams. Another technique which is great for revising is the 'Flip Card Technique', which is explained in the following video.


Students will also be encouraged to create an overall summary sheet at the end of each term. These can be kept

PORT Curtis Sport

Port Curtis Trials The majority of the Port Curtis sporting trials will be held during Term 1. The dates for these trials can be found on the College website (with links to the Port Curtis calendars), Student Google Page (under the 'Sport @ Chanel' tab), on Parent Lounge (with links to the Port Curtis calendars) and in the Daily Notices. This year we will be using electronic nominations for Port Curtis trials. Students will have access (both at school and at home) to the nomination forms via the Student Google Page under 'Sport @ Chanel'. For the most up-to-date information about Port Curtis Sport, please 'like' the Port Curtis School Sport Facebook page. Capricornia School Sport app can be downloaded from the Google Play app store and the IPhone app store (links for both can be found on the Chanel College Website).

If your child wishes to nominate for a trial, they are to complete the relevant Google form. If a student has put their name down for a trial, I will forward to them (via their Pastoral Care

folder) the Parent Consent and Medical forms. The Consent forms MUST be returned to the College by the due date as late nominations will not be accepted. Students nominating for Port Curtis trials should have the intention of making themselves available for Capricornia trials. Please note: 12 Year olds (DOB 2007) will still compete in the Primary school Port Curtis trials. All nominations need to come through the College and the same procedures for nominations mentioned above apply to the 12- year-old students. Term 1 is very busy with sporting trials for 12 year olds and 13 – 19 year olds, so it is important to remind your student to listen to the morning notices for the upcoming trials.

Interhouse Carnivals

Friday 8 February marks the start of the Interhouse sporting carnivals with the Swimming Carnival. It is a College expectation that all students attend this carnival, which will be a day full of fun, House Spirit and loads of time to get into the pool with friends.

This is an all-day event with students arriving and leaving from the pool (they do not need to come to the College, rolls will be marked down at the pool). Students will be able to participate in a variety of events: competitive 50m races, participation races or both, and novelty events. No nominations for events need to be taken for the competitive races. Information for parents will be available through the College Newsletter and Parent Lounge next week. As this is the first Inter-House Carnival for the year, I encourage all students to participate and set the participation levels and House spirit for the Year.

CARNIVAL CALENDAR

Swimming Carnival - Term 1 Week 2, Friday 8 February

CHANEL COLLEGE SWIMMING CARNIVAL – FRIDAY 8 FEBRUARY

TIME: Pool opens 8.30 am Roll marked 8.45 am Events begin 9.00 am Carnival finishes 3.00 pm

TRANSPORT: If possible all students are to be dropped off at the pool (8.30 am) and picked-up (3.00 pm) from the Pool. If students are unable to organise transport directly to the pool they are to come to Chanel. The students will be taken to and from the pool by the Chanel Bus. In the afternoon all students who need to catch buses from Chanel College will be returned to the College in time to do so.

UNIFORM: All students must be wearing their House shirt, a wide PARENTS/SPECTATORS brimmed hat and footwear (thongs or shoes)

- *Shorts must be appropriate for a
- Swimming Carnival (board shorts allowed).
- *All students MUST wear sunscreen throughout the day (this will be supplied for you)
- *Footwear **MUST** be worn while entering and leaving the aquatic centre and pool (thongs are acceptable).
- *Bikinis are not appropriate wear for a
- College swimming carnival. 1 piece togs for girls and swimming shorts for boys to be worn when in the water.
- *Bring a towel, food/snacks, sunscreen, zinc + plenty of water

HATS: Wide brimmed hats MUST be worn all day. Your hat MUST be on your head as you enter the pool otherwise you will be sent back to the College by bus to collect your College hat (and an infringement will be issued).

NO CAPS ALLOWED

FOOD: Very limited food is available from the Pool Canteen. Students are encouraged to bring their lunch and snacks. *Bring water bottle

RACES: Competitive 50m Races

-Only students wishing to go for Age Champion need to swim in these races.

⇒NO heats – all competitive races are

FINALS (fastest time overall from all competitive swimmers in the age division will get the points for first place).

Participation Races

- all students can compete to earn 1 House point
- will be held after the competitive race for each age division
- students can use floaties for these races

- ⇒Parents and/or spectators attending, will be required to pay the pool entrance fee of \$3.00 before entering the pool facility.
- ⇒Parents and/or spectators can sit at the chairs and tables behind the shallow end. They will not be permitted to enter the swimming pool area.

EARLY DEPARTURES

- ⇒Students will only be allowed to leave the Aquatic Centre early if they are collected by their parent/s and have a signed note.
- ⇒Students leaving early need to have a Pass Out prior to the carnival or a signed note on the day if they are leaving the pool early. Parents MUST pick up students leaving early from the entrance of the Aquatic Centre.

Sports News

Mouthguard Policy

In 2019, mouth protection is MANDATORY in the following contact sports:

Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union and Water Polo.

It is recommended for Soccer.

The Department of Education strongly recommends that students wear custom-fitted mouthguards.

Wearing an appropriately designed and made mouthguard while participating in sport will protect against dental injuries. Players of all ages involved in sports and activities where they are at risk of an injury to the face should protect their teeth with a properly fitted mouthguard. This includes sports where there is a risk of collision, falling and/or contact from other players or equipment such as balls, bats, sticks or racquets.


Student medical forms for Port Curtis Sport now acknowledge the mandatory wearing of mouthguards for Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Waterpolo and the recommended use of them in Soccer. All parent/carers will have to sign this form stating that they understand and agree to this process. If students are competing in any trials for the above sports, (except soccer) they MUST have a mouthguard, or they will be unable to compete.

These measures will also be enforced with Chanel College sport. All students participating in Interschool Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union they MUST wear mouthguards to play. Training for Confraternity Rugby League and Rugby 7s will also require the mandatory wearing of a mouthguard – if a student does not have a mouthguard, they will not be permitted to train or play.




