


From the Principal

Building Projects

It's nearly the end of Week 2 of term and our building projects appear to be on track.

I am expecting word next week on exactly when the works will start on the redevelopment of the car park. It is anticipated it will be around the week beginning 10 August with works taking approximately 8 weeks. There will be major changes to the entry and exit to the College at this time. We are currently working on a traffic management plan which I will communicate to all members of our community as soon as we are clear on the details. The safety of our students is paramount during this building period, so I would ask for full cooperation from our community in following signage directions. I would also ask parents to seriously consider delaying their pick up time by 10 minutes in the afternoon to assist the traffic flow out of the College grounds. This is definitely going to be a case of a "short term pain for a long term gain". The new car park will address a major community concern regarding parking and will ease the traffic congestion issue at the end of the school day.

The new administration building will be built opposite the existing administration building. This facility will house most of our teaching staff, school officers and the Leadership Team. It will also include improved sick bay facilities for our students and interview spaces for parents. It is anticipated that this will be completed early in Term 1 of 2016.

The new Industrial Technology and Design (Manual Arts) building will involve the re-development of our existing Art and Music centre in the Mercy Wing and will include an extension to this building. This building will include woodwork and metalwork facilities, a product development room, computer room for Graphics and digital technology and an area to safely secure our College bus. It is hoped that this will be ready for the commencement of the 2016 school year.

The "flow on" effect for this is that the Art and Music areas will need to be temporarily relocated. Music will be moving into SM101 and Visual Art will be moving into 5 Paterson Street, a property adjoining the College. The long term view is that the existing Manual Arts facility will be refurbished to provide a new Arts Precinct.

The extension to the Chapel will start in Term 4, which will increase the capacity of the Chapel and make it more prominent feature as we enter the College.





Visit from Bishop Michael and seminarians

We were very privileged last week to have a visit from Bishop Michael who celebrated our weekly Thursday Mass with Ms Ryan's Year 10 Study of Religion class and members of staff. Bishop Michael also visited a number of classes to speak with students and their teachers. QUT Engineering Challenge

During the last week of Term 2, I was in Mackay, participating in the 2015 QUT Mackay Chemical Process Engineering Challenge with QMEA. Sixteen Year 11 and 12 students from across Queensland participated in this challenge at the QUT Biocommodities Pilot Plant in Mackay. This Pilot Plant converts cellulosic biomass (from sugarcane), into renewable transport fuels (bioethanol) and other high value biocommodities. As part of the challenge, my group was asked to conduct a feasibility study on how the current process can be changed, in order to produce an alternative end product other than ethanol. We received lots of help from engineers, research scientists and university mentors to develop a proposal, which was presented on the final day to senior management, QUT experts and industry representatives.

Being able to walk around the pilot plant, seeing how each individual step in the process operates was very interesting and I met lots of interesting people who have experience in the engineering profession. The experience gave me lots of insight into a potential career path, as I was able to see what it is like to be a

process engineer firsthand.

Year 10 Structured Workplace Learning

The Year 10 Structured Workplace Learning agreement packs will be returned to the students next week. Once the student has received their Work Experience pack, they are required to make an appointment with the host employer, get all three coloured copies of the Work Experience insurance agreement signed by the host employer, student and parent/care giver. Once these three copies of the paperwork have been signed by all three parties, the Work Experience pack must be returned to the office, so Ms Volp can sign them. Once this step has been completed the student is covered under insurance, and the Work Experience may commence. DO NOT LEAVE THIS UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE! All paperwork MUST be returned to the office by Wednesday 5 August, to ensure all signatures can be collected. Ms Volp is unable to sign the contracts if they are missing the other signatures.
