BADGE PRESENTATION CEREMONY

The 70 pioneer students of Stella Maris College received their college badges at a short but impressive ceremony on Monday morning. The school badge is a white star, the symbolism here being for Our Lady Star of the Sea, the College patroness. the centre of the badge is a gold circle with a superimposed building suggestive of Queensland Alumina Limited and Gladstone's Harbour. Surrounding this circle is a green ring in which the name of the school is inscribed. Supporting the white star is a green scroll bearing the motto, "Courtesy and Truth". Courtesy was chosen as being the outstanding characteristic of the Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy. Truth, because all real education is a search for, and discovery of Truth.

Marist students gather for three-day leadership event in Brisbane

Chanel College Captains, Sophie Ovenden, Lachlan James and Vice Captains, Isabella Aitkenhead and Aiden Parker along with 76 new student leaders and 20 staff members from Marist schools throughout Queensland participated in a three-day leadership conference at Marist College Ashgrove from 29 – 31 January.

Participants looked at styles of leadership, especially in terms of Marist traditions. They gained a greater awareness and understanding of how Marists connect with their school communities and how being part of the Marist family—with our shared responsibilities and resources—can

achieve bigger impacts.

The event looked at the importance of planning for the year ahead, good communication, strategies for networking, and ways of engaging and nurturing younger students.

Students also explored Marist Solidarity's 2016 campaign and its theme—Transform our world one step at a time. They shared ideas about increasing awareness of Marist Solidarity projects, beyond simply planning fundraising activities and what has been done in previous years.

Marist Solidarity schools' liaison Brother Mark Fordyce says, "Students experienced a strong sense of belonging to our Marist family and the call to reach out to other Marists in the Asia-Pacific region."



Transport

If possible all students are to be dropped off (8.30 am) and picked-up (3.00 pm) from the Pool. If students are unable to organise transport directly to the pool they are to come to Chanel. You will be taken to and from the pool by the Chanel Bus. In the afternoon all students who need to catch buses from Chanel College will be returned to the College in time to do so.

Uniform

All students must be wearing their House shirt and a wide brimmed hat (no singlets allowed)

- · Shorts must be appropriate for a Swimming Carnival (board shorts allowed)
- · All students must wear **sunscreen** throughout the day (this will be supplied for you)
- · Footwear must be worn while entering and leaving the pool (thongs are acceptable)
- · String bikinis are not appropriate wear for a College swimming carnival

Hats

Wide brimmed hats must be worn all day.

Your hat must be on your head as you enter the pool otherwise you will be sent back to the College by bus to collect your College hat.


