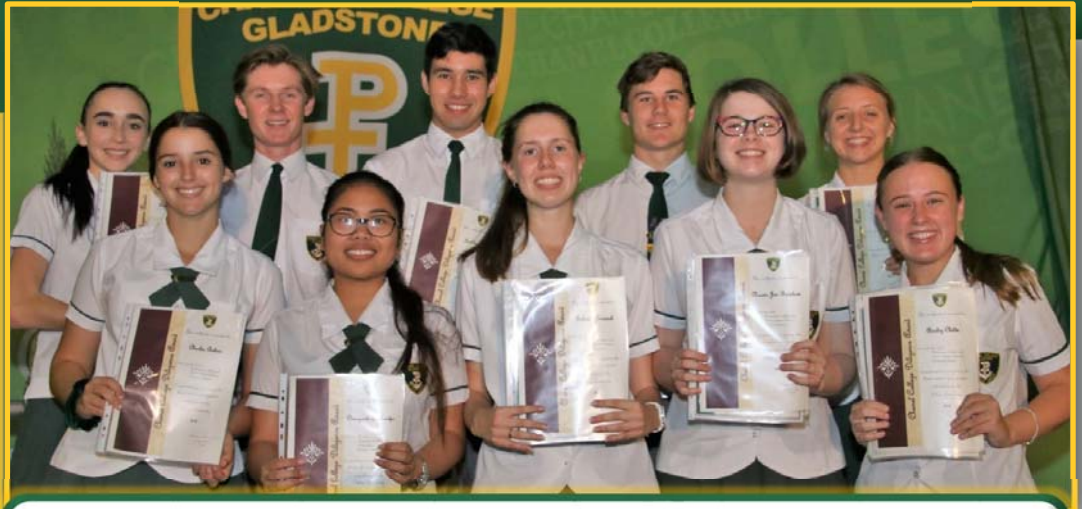

Last Friday, Chanel College students and staff stood in silence for 1-minute to show that they stand in solidarity with those who live in poverty.

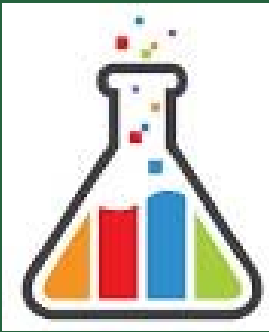
## CONGRATULATIONS SUMMAH

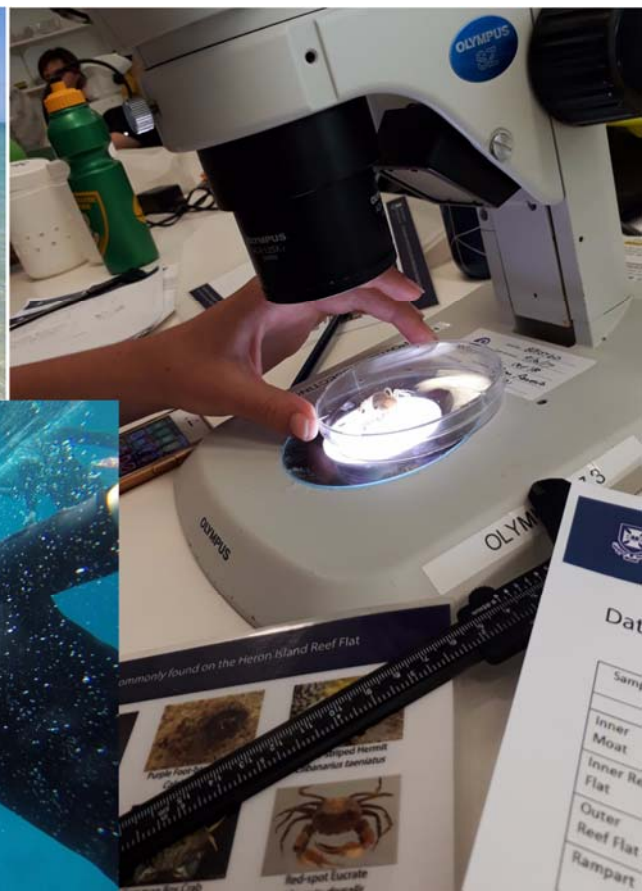


## Heron Island Excursion

During the last school holidays, five students from Chanel Colleges, Oliver Kirk, Aimee Kane, Makenzie Box, Parker Hutchieson and I, accompanied by Mr Rose, as well as students from Tannum Sands state High, Gladstone State High School, Toolooa State High School and Trinity College, were fortunate enough to travel to the University of Queensland (UQ) research facility on Heron Island and participate in various research activities. Activities included coral and sediment transects, crab faecal analysis, algae analysis, and crab identification. We also had the opportunity to go on many snorkel

adventures in the reefs surrounding the island. We went for shore snorkels where we were fortunate enough to interact with turtles, sharks, rays, fish, and coral which was one of the highlights of the trip. The University of Queensland and Conoco-Phillips sponsored and facilitated this experience for all who participated and we all are appreciative for this once in a lifetime opportunity.
