Freedom of Entry to Navy Cadets

During medieval times, establishing good relations with the citizens of walled cities earned the privilege of entry to the city and passage through it. This privilege, not readily won and highly prized, was known as Freedom of Entry. The City of Brisbane granted Freedom of Entry to the Australian Navy Cadets on Saturday 27 October.

The granting of Freedom of Entry remains the highest accolade a town or city can bestow upon a group or individual; it is no less readily won or lightly given today than it was centuries ago. The October event took place in the centre of Australia's third largest city.

For Freedom of Entry into the city, the Lord Mayor inspected the parade, before giving a speech and presenting the ANC with a scroll granting permission to march through the streets of the city. During the march, the group was also challenged by the police on behalf of the Lord Mayor, and then was granted passage through the city.

Approximately 340 Cadets and Staff from 3 Flotillas from across Queensland and New South Wales attended the event. 13 Cadets from TS Gladstone travelled to attend the event, including 2 Chanel College students, Reece Turner and Madisyn Harris.


