Safe Haven and Tondoon Botanic Gardens Excursion

Year 11 Geography students were able to get up close and personal with some of our endangered flora and fauna and the passionate conservationists who are working to save not only the endangered, but all native plants and animals, in the Gladstone region. Many thanks go to Tina Janssen and Rebecca Hendry for sharing their expertise with our students.



Founder of Safe Haven - AACE (Australian Animal Care and Education) Tina Janssen expressed her deep concerns for the biodiversity in our local region to Year 11 Geography students, stating that in the next 25 years Australia will experience a mass extinction of native flora and fauna. Safe Haven is a sanctuary dedicated to the rescue and rehabilitation of all injured, ill or orphaned native Australian wildlife. With their main focus being on the Southern Hairy-Nosed Wombats, Tina strives to increase the understanding of the wombats breeding cycle and has partnered with the University of Queensland as part of a captive breeding program aimed at conserving wombat populations. We are very grateful for the opportunity to visit Tina and her fellow volunteers and see their hard work and tireless efforts to provide a safe home for ill and endangered species of native Australian wildlife.

Ryan Lilley

Rebecca Hendry, a member of the Gladstone Regional Council, talked to us about the significance of plant species around Gladstone. She informed us about the different factors such as climate change and human activities that have impacted our environment in past decades. Rebecca explained how critical this damage can be, resulting in local or even regional extinction of species. It was very interesting hearing her talking about the significance of plant species and how important they are to our ecosystems.

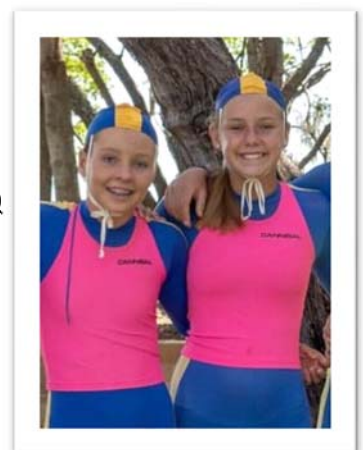

QRC Girls in

Resources Mentoring Program 2019

A select number of Queensland Minerals and Energy Academe (QMEA) students will be offered the opportunity to be mentored by outstanding resources sector women.

The Queensland Resources Council (QRC) in partnership with Women in Mining and Resources Queensland (WIMARQ) is expanding its highly-regarded women's mentoring program to include girls selected from QMEA's 58 schools who are completing year 12 in 2019.

The transition from school to further study or into the workforce can be challenging so QMEA is offering up to 20 scholarships for its new girls' mentoring program. Year-12 girls will be matched with a mentor who will provide valuable guidance through this time.

The aim of the program is to provide encouragement and mentoring support for girls intending to transition into education and training for vocational and professional careers in the resources sector.

Mentors will provide the girls with the benefit of their own experiences and smooth the way as they tackle the transition to university life or trade training. It's envisaged that this mentoring will provide girls with tools to navigate what can be a very challenging time for school leavers, particularly girls entering male-dominated occupations.

The highly-structured program, which has attracted funding from the

Queensland Government, and many of Queensland's leading resources companies, will begin on International Women's Day on 8 March 2019 and conclude in early August 2019.

The program will be administered by Metisphere, an organisational development consultancy, which developed and manages Women in Mining Mentoring Programs in three Australian states along with a global program. Metisphere's founder, Dr Ali Burston is a leadership consultant and organisational psychologist.

The girls mentoring program forms part of QRC's Women in Resources Action Plan to increase the proportion of women in non-traditional roles in the Queensland resources sector to at least 20 percent by 2020.

Mentors will be carefully selected from women who have completed the QRC/WIMARQ women's mentoring program.

Applicants will be required to address several selection criteria.

The scholarships will cover the cost of the mentoring program, as well as travel and accommodation to Brisbane for regionally-based girls.

Applications close: Friday 23 November
