The Chanel Person of the Year is the Principal's Award. A previous Principal, Br. Roger Burke, started this award in the late 1980s. It is a tradition that has been maintained by the Principals since that time. Recipients of this award must have given outstanding service to the College community over an extended period of time. It is not easy to reach the standard required to achieve this award.

To achieve this award, a person must meet all of the following criteria:

- The person must have completed his/her time at the College.
- A current member of the College community must have nominated the person.
- The nomination must be in writing and address all of the criteria other than those relating to financial commitments.
- The level of service must have been extraordinary, significantly above that offered by other members of the community.
- The service must have been of a benefit to a significant proportion of the College community.
- The level of service must have been maintained over a significant number of years.
- The person must have consistently acted as a positive ambassador within the College and the wider community.
- The person must have worked cooperatively with the College administration.
- The person must be a Christian role model that others can be encouraged to emulate.
- The person must not have any outstanding financial commitment to the College.
- The College must not have any outstanding financial commitment to the person involved.

Because of the nature of some of the criteria, the decision is not open for public debate. The Principal's decision is final and binding. Nomination forms are available from the College Office. The decision will be based on the nominations received by the closing date which is Friday 10 May 2019 at 4.00 pm.

A warm welcome back to our existing families and to new students, commencing their studies at Chanel College in Term 2.

It is with great enthusiasm I take on the role of Acting Assistant Principal, Pastoral Support and Planning for the first five weeks of this term. Chanel College is widely recognised as an educational institution whose focus is on nurturing holistically the whole child; providing opportunity for students to develop academically, emotionally, socially and spiritually. It is this emphasis on the student's whole growth that ensures students thrive and prosper.

You will have now received formal feedback on your child's Term 1 Progress Report. As the name suggests, this report provides a snapshot of the progress your child is making in his/her academic study and as he/she develops important learning behaviours. Each of the learning behaviours described within the report is considered relevant to student achievement. Students who consistently demonstrate these behaviours are forming habits which will assist them in reaching their potential academically. These behaviours are also developing skills for life-long learning and so include a number of the Key Competencies identified by both the Australian and Queensland Governments as essential for effective participation in adult life as well as in further education and employment.

Talking with your children about their progress is a vital part of encouraging them to be responsible, resilient and proactive learners. DO listen to the key player. We should, as parents, realise that our children are insightful about their own strengths and weaknesses. Ask your child what he/she thinks about his/her report card, what he/she is most proud of, or disappointed in, and why he/she believes about the comments on their report. It is also important to remember to look at the big picture. While grades are an important reflection of progress, for parents, the focus on learning behaviours, such as initiative, problem solving capabilities, organisation and independent thinking, just as important because they are the long-term indicators of future success.

Next week our teachers will be available for Parent Teacher Interviews. This is a wonderful opportunity for students, parents and caregivers to meet with their child's teacher to discuss students results and progress. These appointments can be made via Parent Lounge. If you have any concerns or problems with bookings, please contact the College Office.

Curriculum Matters

Welcome back to Term 2.

Our learning this term will be actioned packed and it will be important that your child maintains a balance towards his/her studies and learning in the classroom. At the end of last term, we issued our Term 1 Progress Reports. These provide an opportunity to ascertain how well your child is settling into his/her learning. To follow up on this, all parents are warmly invited to meet with their child's teachers at the Parent Teacher Interview Evening on the 2nd May. This will be a great chance to have a conversation about the successes and challenges your child is experiencing in his/her new subjects for 2019. We value the partnership and communication between our families and the College.

An important part of our curriculum delivery at Chanel College is the College Chromebook Program. It is essential that every child has a fully operational Chromebook. The Chromebook runs the Google web-based Chrome OS. As a GSuite school, we use Google based technology to support the curriculum delivery in the classroom. Most of the Chromebook's documents and apps exist in the 'cloud' rather than on the device itself. We use Chromebooks because they are easy for students to use, they are portable, they boot up fast and have a long lasting battery. Chromebooks have built-in security, there is no risk of unwanted software installations, adjusted settings or malware. The life of a Chromebook is approximately 3 years, however, due to taking very good care of them, many of the devices are lasting longer. One of the main tools used is Google Classroom. This is a Learning Management System and all students should have a different Google classroom for each of their classes. The Chromebooks enable our students to develop essential technology skills for the future: creating and collaborating; sharing and connecting, learning beyond textbooks. Therefore, coming into Term 2, students and parents should be checking the following with the Chromebook – does it still have a College Skin (sticker)? Does the battery last for a day without needing to be charged? Attending to this and ensuring the Chromebook is being used correctly will also be improving the learning of your child.

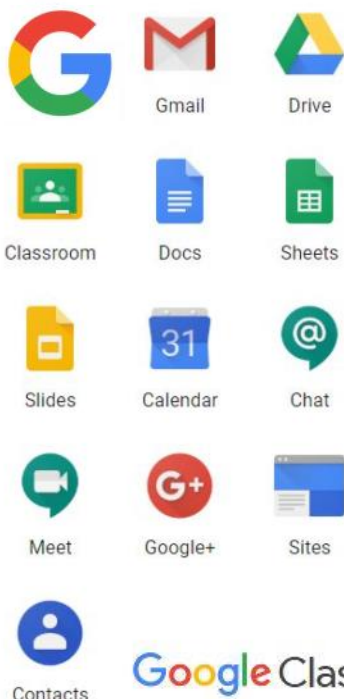

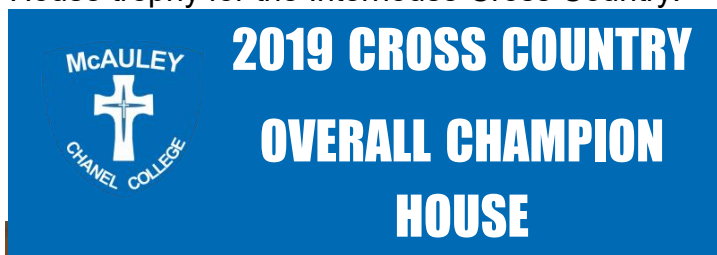

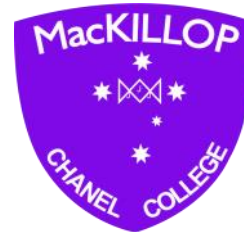

Uniform

All students are to wear House uniform for both days; hats must be on when not competing.

Exceptions – black/dark coloured running shorts/tights, running shoes, spikes (all events except 800m, 1500m, 3000m High Jump and Relays)

Outfits – FRIDAY ONLY, must have House shirt as part of the outfit

All students will wear wrist bands for their age group – these will be distributed on Thursday and are to be worn over the 2 days.

Students are to stay with and compete in their DOB group.

NOMINATIONS

All students are automatically nominated for all Field Events – if you do not want to compete you need to tell the teacher in charge of the event at the start and you will be required to help measure, rake, etc.,

When you are doing a Field Event, it will always be in alphabetical order by House so make sure you are organised. If you do not wish to do the event, tell the teacher on duty to cross your name out.

Banned items

No Ipods, Mobile phones, MP3 players etc.

No footballs, soccer balls, etc., - you are there to participate in an athletics carnival and when you are not participating you should be supporting your team mates.

Tuckshop

Run as usual – sandwiches, drinks, ice blocks

Limited hot food

Powerade will be sold

Field events

Jumps: High, Triple and Long Jump – ***If you wish to do High Jump Flop, you MUST get a permission letter from Miss Kickbusch, get signed off by your athletics coach & bring on the day. Mr Davis must see you do the correct technique and approve it, otherwise you will do scissors – NO note NO Flop technique.***

DISCUS

Parental permission is required for students to participate in the Discus event – please refer to permission letter on Parent Longue.

Discus (no spinning) and Javelin (NO RUN UP due to area restrictions)

Track Events

Spikes can be worn for the 100m, 200m and 400m events

If spikes are worn during the relay, the next runner to receive the baton must also be wearing spikes.

NO HEATS – ALL races are timed finals. The fastest time overall will win the race. Winners announced after the following Field event rotation.

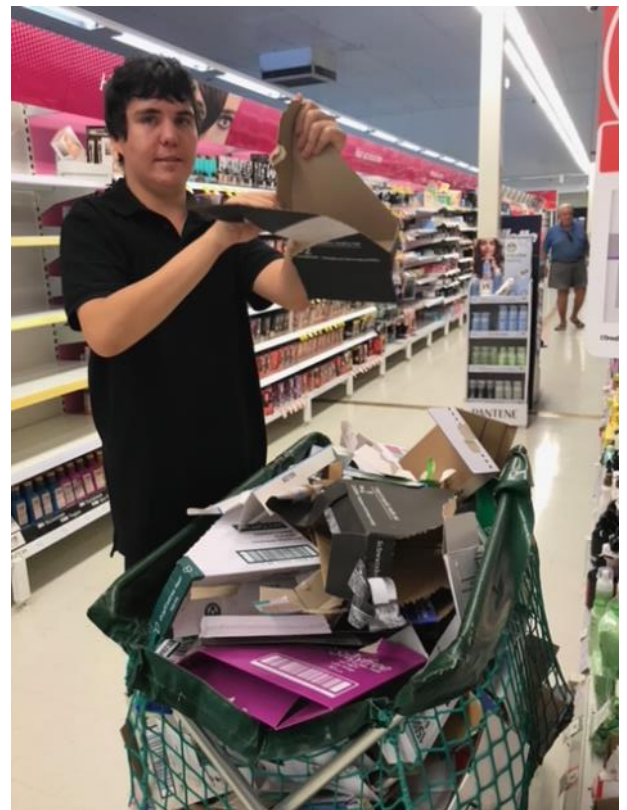
