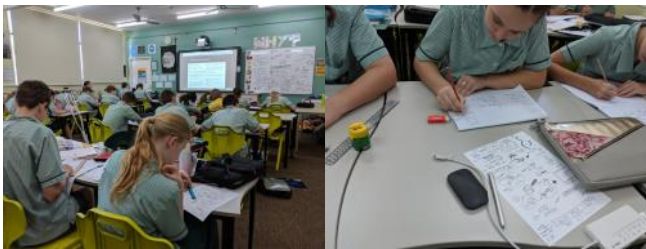

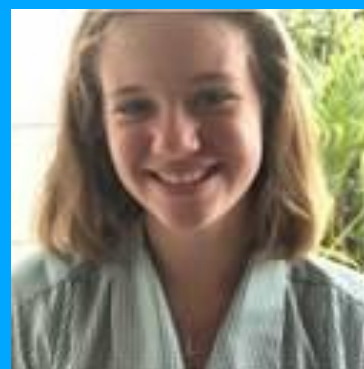
is Shaving for a Cure on March 16 to help beat blood cancer.

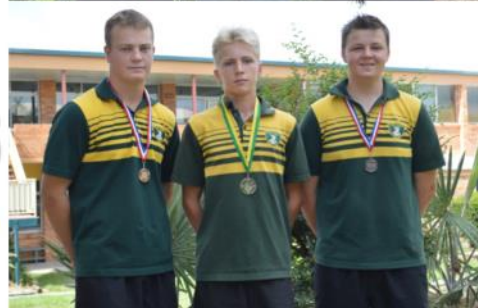
