Australian Catholic Bishops' 2019-20 Social Justice Statement - Part II

The title of the Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement for this year is *Making it Real: Genuine human encounter in our digital world*. The Statement affirms the positive possibilities for encounter and solidarity offered by new digital media, while warning of those elements that are harmful to the dignity of individuals and the common good.

In the last newsletter we highlighted the first five of ten steps we can take towards making our online presence one that fosters genuine human encounter. The final five steps are presented below ...

6. The local community is a place to make the virtual real

Social media platforms are venues not just for socialising, but for raising awareness of local issues, becoming politically engaged, and harnessing the power of crowdsourcing, but do not limit it to there – communicate with the physical community as well.

7. We must protect the personal data of citizens

Join the growing call for regulation of platform data gathering which increases notification and consumer consent requirements, with external audits and penalties for breaches of privacy.

8. Join the call for transparency and accountability

Major corporations need to open their algorithms, data governance and business models to the communities in which they operate.

9. Truth and trustworthiness must be guaranteed

Our right to truthful information and trustworthy broadcasting requires greater regulation of digital platforms, with sanctions for the spread of fake, divisive and offensive content.

10. We are called to be citizens of the digital world

We all have a role to play in making this a space where hatred, divisions and falsehoods are rejected. Let's foster a neighbourhood promoting those attributes and social values that lend themselves to genuine human encounter – love, understanding, beauty, goodness, truth and trustworthiness, joy and hope.






