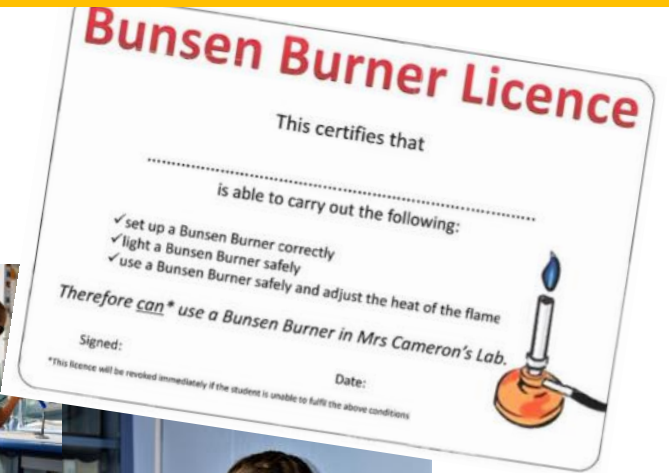
Science

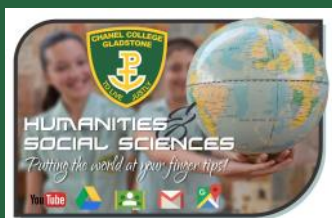

Food & Nutrition is an exciting new subject. Which includes the study of food in the context of food science, nutrition and food technologies.

In Unit 1, students explore sectors of the food system and the nutrients that make up our food. They explore fundamentals of food science through practical investigation of the nutritional and scientific properties of vitamins, minerals and protein in foods.

The first experiment investigated the effects of physical manipulation, temperature and chemicals on Vitamin C in frozen, dehydrated, fresh and canned peas. Various conclusions were drawn about the bioavailability of these products and an interesting observation about the food miles of these products (France, Germany and New Zealand).

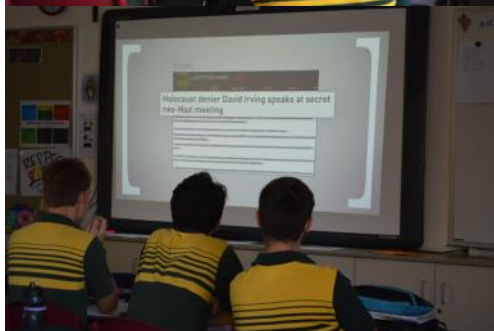
•This day in history....

The bombing of Darwin, on the 19 February 1942, during World War II was a critical moment in Australia's history. Japanese forces, which had been advancing southwards for two months, attacked the Australian mainland. This was the first time that the Australian mainland had been attacked by a foreign power. According to the Australian Government Anzac Centenary website, there were more than 80 raids over Northern Australia in the following 9 months.



•In the Classroom

Year 10 History students are presently learning about the causes, events and ramifications of World War II in Europe and Australia's contribution in the European and North African spheres of the war. Recently, an ABC News story lamented the fact that many Australian's seem largely unaware of the importance of the bombing of Darwin during WWII, pointing to the lack of emphasis on this topic in school curriculum across Australia. At Chanel, the significance of the Japanese attack on Australian sovereign territory has been included in the Year 10 curricula since the introduction of the Australian Curriculum. As part of their course, Year 10 History students will study the impacts of World War II on Australia. This includes the bombing of Darwin and the shifting political alliances which occurred as a consequence of the war in the Pacific gaining momentum.



•Out and about

To support and develop students' historical understandings, an excursion for interested Year 10 students to the Rockhampton Heritage Village and the CQ Military and Artifacts Museum is planned for March. Further information can be obtained from Year 10 Modern History Teachers and more specifically, Mrs Van Krimpen, who is coordinating this excursion.

The Women in Navy Technical Trades Camp will provide a hands-on and interactive experience for young women who are considering a career in Navy technical trades.

The camp is open to female students in Years 10, 11 & 12 aged between 16 – 18 years of age. Successful participants must have passes in Year 10 English, Maths and Science and applicants will need to provide proof as part of the application process (e.g. copy of latest report or letter of confirmation from school).

Based at HMAS Cairns, participants will be exposed to various sub-units at HMAS Cairns to gain knowledge and understanding of a range of technical trades available within Navy.

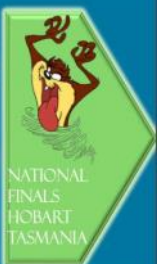

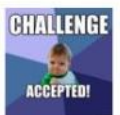
