Recently, we have held Subject Selection Information Evenings to provide valuable information to help students and their families make informed decisions for the future. A special thank you to all families who joined us and the kind comments regarding these evenings. I do value their importance in a family's ability to make informed decisions.

Our Year 8, 9 and 10 students are now involved in an exploratory and decision making process. They will be working with their Pastoral Care Teachers and their Career Advisors who will assist them in their planning. These decisions need to be very individual and needs to focus on the question, "What will be the best plan for me?"
