2019 CHANEL PERSON OF THE YEAR

One of the highlights of our Chanel Day celebrations each year is the announcement of the Chanel Person of the Year. This is an award that was started by past principal, Br Roger Burke, in the late 1980s. Almost forty years later, the Chanel Person of the Year award has become a special tradition at Chanel College.

The person who receives this award is recognised for his/her dedication and contribution, over several years, to the flourishing of our College.

The Chanel Person of the Year 2019 was a dual award which was shared by Chris Andersen and Ben Platt. Both Chris and Ben were members of the graduating class of 1997 and Chris was the College Captain in that year. Both also played for Chanel's Confraternity team when they were students.

For the last 5 years, and again this year, Chris has coached the First XIII Rugby League for the QISSRL (Queensland Independent Secondary Schools Rugby League) Confraternity Shield competition which is held in the first week of the June/July holidays. He has also coached our teams in the Interschool League competition.

All this time, Ben has worked with Chris as Trainer and Assistant Coach.

Ben and Chris have been absolutely committed to

our Rugby League campaigns. They have given up a week of their time each year to travel with our students to the Confraternity competition wherever it is in Queensland – 2014 on the Gold Coast; 2015 in Ipswich; 2016 in Rockhampton; 2017 in Brisbane; 2018 in Charters Towers and this year, in Bundaberg. Apart from the actual week of competition, they have also given up countless hours to train and prepare our teams over several months in the lead up to the competition.

Last year, during the Confro competition, which saw our boys triumphant in their division, when the competition got the toughest, I witnessed first hand Ben and Chris' calm, reassuring and encouraging presence on the sideline and on the coaching bench.

I know that the expertise, passion and enthusiasm that Chris and Ben have brought to Chanel Rugby League have definitely been appreciated by all the players in the our teams over the past 6 years, and will be in the years to come.

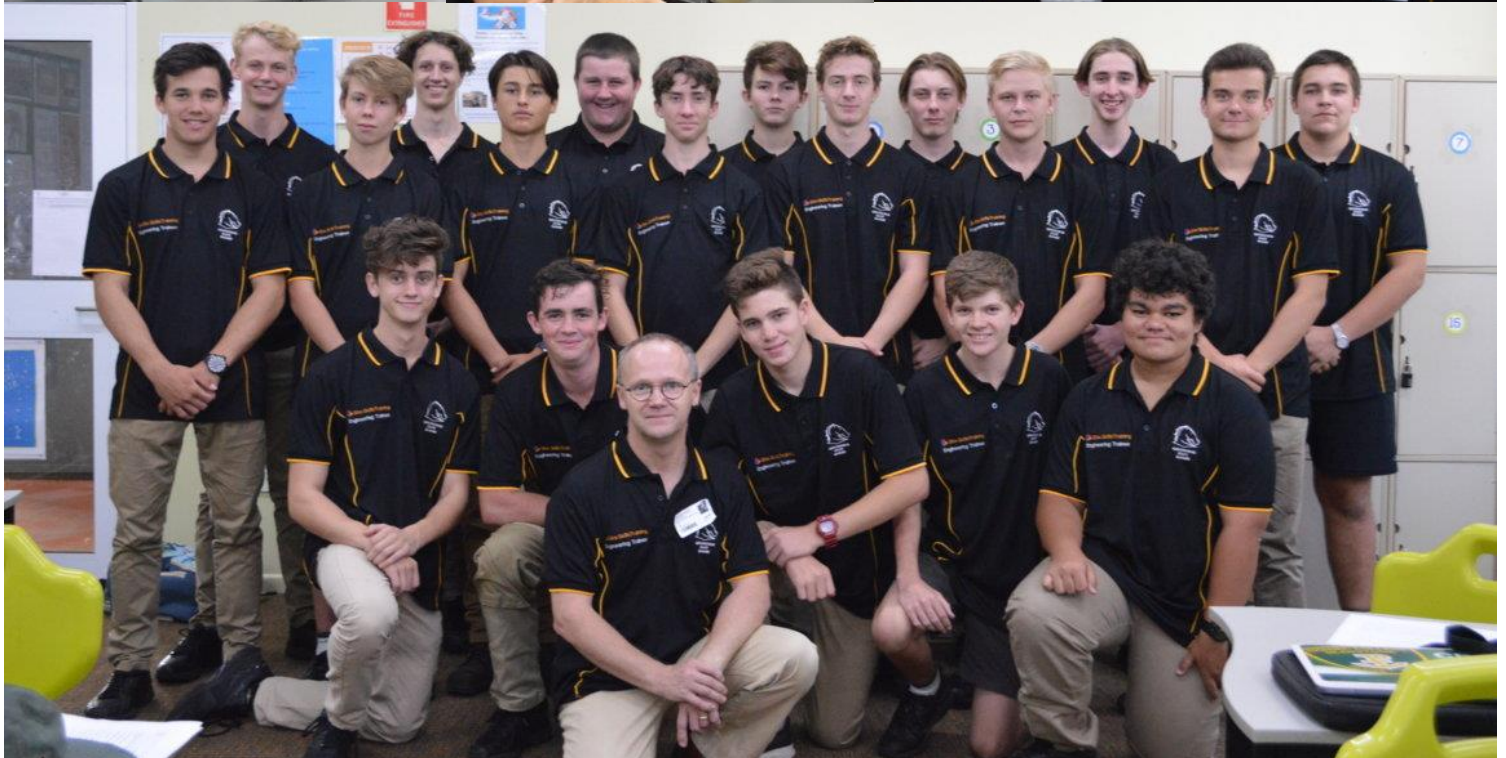

The dual qualifications are MSM20216 Certificate II in Manufacturing Technology/MEM30505 Certificate III Engineering – Technical. This dual qualification is being delivered every Monday in the College’s Design Technology Centre.

Site Skills Training is a Registered Training Organisation and is the provider of the qualification. Site Skills is providing all the resources and the trainer. Chanel College provides the location and some resources.

The students will utilise primary data gained from Alicia's visit in the writing of their business report. This assessment requires students to interpret economic indicators to determine where Gladstone sits on the economy trade cycle and analyse a local business to determine strategies they could implement to assist with productivity. We appreciate Alicia donating her time to share her business experience and knowledge of competitive advantage.

Students will apply these concepts, next term when they participate in the \$20 Boss Program. For this learning experience, students will be provided with \$20 start-up capital to help them create, launch, and operate their enterprise over Term 3. 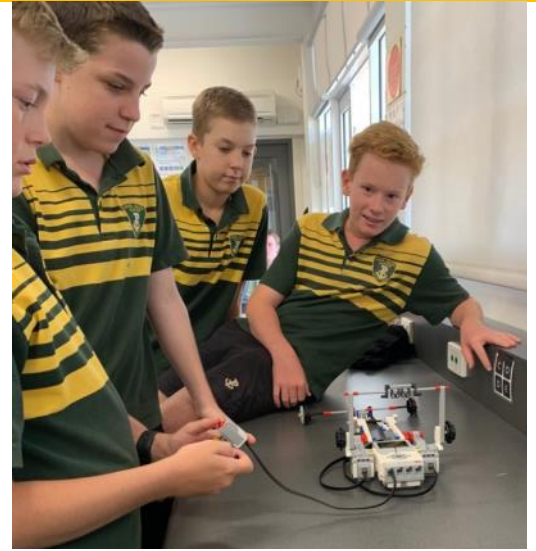

As the winners of Round 1 the students will progress to the National Final that will be held on Tuesday, 23 July 2019. Congratulations!



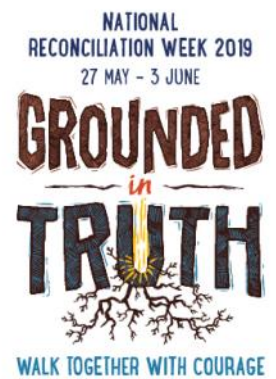
Indigenous Education

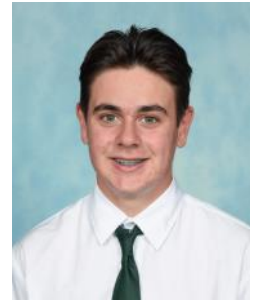

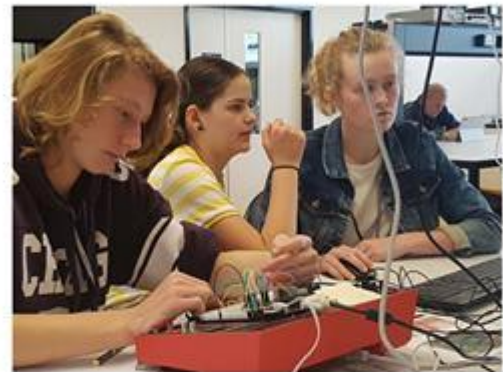
