#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

On Thursday 6 June, while at a meeting at Emmaus College in Rockhampton, I was able to attend their whole campus assembly. Given that 6 June was Queensland Day (and, perhaps coincidentally, the day after Queensland won the first game in the State of Origin series), a focus of the assembly was a celebration of this great state that we call "home".



On the drive back to Gladstone, I decided that I should do a little research into Queensland Day, so that I have a better understanding of this aspect of our history.

Significantly, this year marked the 160<sup>th</sup> 'birthday' of the state of Queensland. While, the move towards the separation of Queensland from New South Wales began in 1851, it was

not until 6 June 1859, when Queen Victoria signed the Letters Patent giving her approval, that Queensland became an independent colony. Perhaps, it was the suggestion that the new colony be known as Queensland, rather than the suggested Cooksland (in honour of Captain James Cook), that influenced her decision! Queen Victoria granted the Queensland Coat of Arms, the oldest State Arms in Australia, to the Colony of Queensland in 1893.

Those of us who have answered the trivia questions on the Bruce Highway as we drive to Brisbane will know that our state floral emblem is the Cooktown Orchid, our bird emblem is the cassowary, and our animal emblem is the koala. It probably goes without saying that our state colour is maroon, and that Queensland is 'The Sunshine State'. Equally as significant, but perhaps less well known, is Queensland's motto, *Audax at Fidelis*, which translates to *Bold but Faithful*, and the fact that the Coat of Arms, granted by Queen Victoria in 1893, is the oldest State Coat of Arms in Australia.

For students at Chanel College, the 7 June has an added significance, as it is the Feast Day of St Marcellin Champagnat (1789 – 1840), the founder of the Marist Brothers. The son of peasant farmers, Marcellin was ordained to the priesthood in July 1816. He dreamt of transforming the lives and situations of young people, especially those who were very poor, by offering them an education that would allow them to transcend their circumstances. Marcellin's vision lives on at Chanel College because our founding traditions are both Marist and Mercy. As a College, today we join with students in Marcellin House in thanking God for the life and work of St Marcellin Champagnat, and for the gift of an education at Chanel College, that focuses on the development of the whole person.



This year saw plenty of 'first' such as:


- the school first entered in The Canterbury Shield for rugby league with its team, the 'First XIII', which set up the tradition of football pride within the College;


