## **Bundaberg Chess Club**

The Bundaberg Chess Club is intending to continue Sunday Junior Chess Tournaments on a regular basis for 2020. The Junior Chess Tournaments are held on the last Sunday of the month, for 8 months of the year.

## School Safety

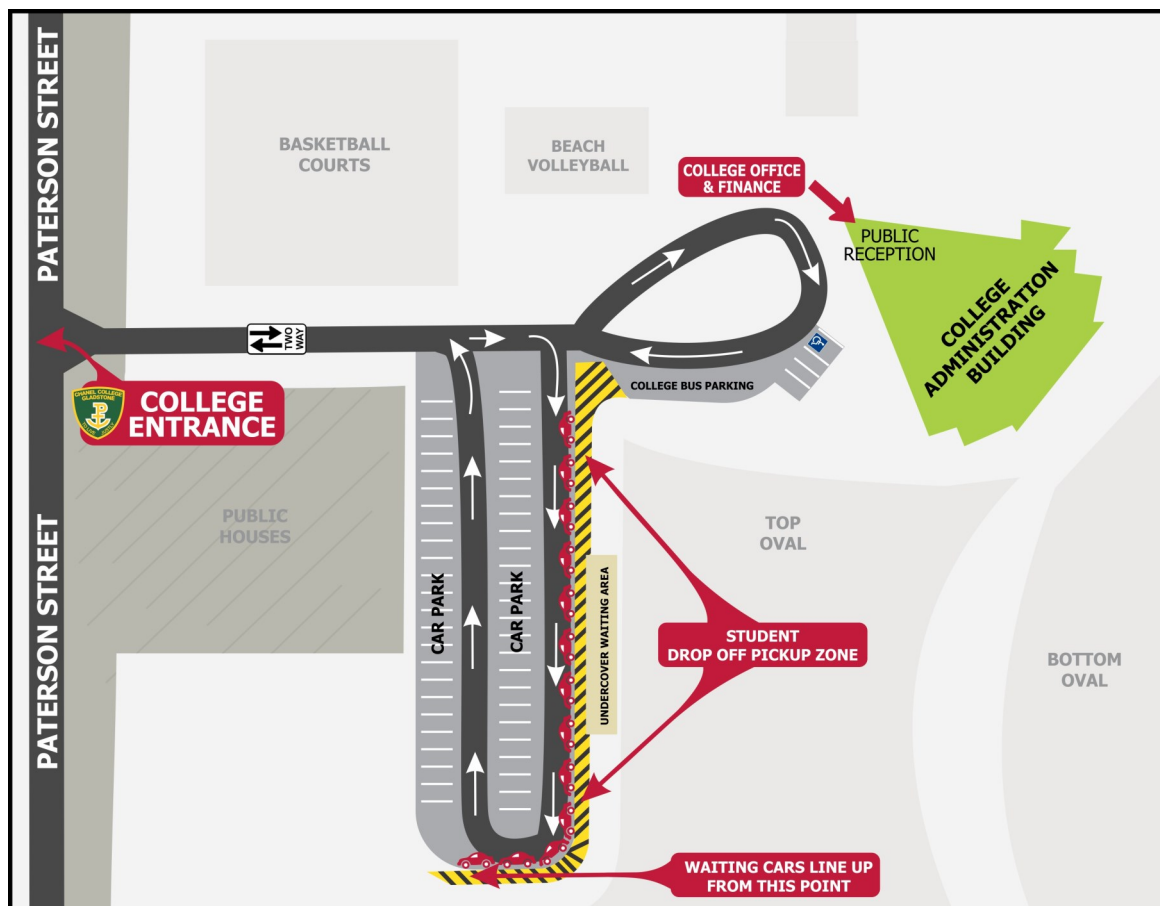
Over the past few days the College has received a number of complaints regarding students not crossing safely on Paterson, Morley and Larsen Streets. As we provide a safe 'Drop-off' and 'Pick-up' area inside our College, we strongly advise all parents, grandparents and carers to use this facility.

The 'School Zone' speed limit around our College is 40 km per hour between the hours of 7.30 – 9.00 am, 2.30 – 4.00 pm. Inside the College grounds our speed limit is 15km.

If you do park on Paterson St, or Morley St, please ensure that you are not parking across driveways and blocking the access of residents to their properties.

After 3.25 pm on most days, the pick-up area is car free, so staggering pick-up times will help with traffic congestion. If you have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to contact the College.

## 2020 Sporting Year

Welcome back to Chanel for 2020 and what is going to be a very, very, big year for sport. At Chanel we love celebrating and acknowledging student achievements in the sporting arena. I am not always aware of these achievements but would invite you to share these results with me so, that as a community, we can congratulate and share student sporting successes. Please contact me via email or phone so we can acknowledge the wealth of sporting talent at Chanel College.

There have been many changes to the sport calendar, both at Chanel College (dates for the Interhouse Carnivals) and the Port Curtis Sports trials calendars. It is important that parents and students are aware of the EARLIER dates and times for both Chanel and Port Curtis sporting events. Please ensure that you have 'liked' the Chanel College Facebook page & Port Curtis School Sport Facebook page for the most up-to-date information regarding Interhouse Carnival dates and Port Curtis trial dates and times.

Students have access to both the secondary (13-19 years of age) and the Primary (10-12 years of age) Port Curtis calendars on their Student Google Page.

Parents can access these calendars via Parent Lounge.

## PORT CURTIS SPORT

### Port Curtis Trials

The majority of the Port Curtis sporting trials will be held during Term 1. The dates for these trials can be found on the College website (with links to the Port Curtis calendars), Student Google Page (under the 'Sport @ Chanel' tab), on Parent Lounge (with links to the Port Curtis calendars) and in the Daily Notices. This year we will be using electronic nominations for Port Curtis trials. Students will have access (both at school and at home) to the nomination forms via the Student Google Page under 'Sport @ Chanel', Port Curtis, Port Curtis Trial Nomination forms. For the most up-to-date information about Port Curtis Sport, please 'like' the Port Curtis School Sport Facebook page. The Capricornia School Sport app can be downloaded from the Google Play app store and the Iphone app store (links for both can be found on the Chanel College Website).

If your child wishes to nominate for a trial, he / she is to complete the relevant Google form. If a student has put his / her name down for a trial, I will forward to them (via their Pastoral Care folder) the Parent Consent and Medical forms. The Consent forms MUST be returned to the College by the due date as late nominations will not be accepted. Students nominating for Port Curtis trials should have the intention of making themselves available for Capricornia trials. Please note: 12 year olds (DOB 2008) will still compete in the Primary School Port Curtis trials. All nominations need to come through the College and the same procedures for nominations mentioned above apply to 12 year old students. Term 1 is very busy with sporting trials for 12 year olds and 13 – 19 year olds, so it is important to remind your student to listen to the Morning Notices for the upcoming trials.

### **10-19 Years - Change to payments for students in Port Curtis teams in 2020**

This year there has been a change to the way payments are to be made. The levy has now been split into two payments - one to be made directly to Capricornia Sport online (\$8.80 trial levy) and the remainder to be made to the office of the school where your child attends. Instructions regarding this new online payment will be included with the team paperwork.

## Mouthguard Policy

In 2020, mouth protection is **MANDATORY** in the following contact sports:

Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union and Water Polo.

It is also recommended for use in Soccer.

The Department of Education strongly recommends that students wear custom-fitted mouthguards.

Wearing an appropriately designed and made mouthguard while participating in sport will protect against dental injuries. Players of all ages involved in sports and activities where they are at risk of an injury to the face should protect their teeth with a properly fitted mouthguard. This includes sports where there is a risk of collision, falling and/or contact from other players or equipment such as balls, bats, sticks or racquets.

Student medical forms for Port Curtis Sport now acknowledge the mandatory wearing of mouthguards for Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union, Waterpolo and the recommended use of them in Soccer. All parent/carers will have to sign this form stating that they understand and agree to this process. If students are competing in any trials for the above sports (except soccer), they **MUST** have a mouthguard, or they will be unable to compete.

**These measures will also be enforced with Chanel College sport.** Students who participate in Interschool Australian Football (AFL), Hockey, Rugby League, Rugby Union **MUST** wear a mouthguard to play. Training for Confraternity Rugby League and Rugby 7s will also require the mandatory wearing of a mouthguard – if a student does not have a mouthguard, he / she will not be permitted to train or play.

## CHANEL COLLEGE SWIMMING CARNIVAL – Tuesday 18 FEBRUARY 2020

**TIME:** Pool opens 8.30 am  
Roll marked 8.45 am  
Events begin 9.00 am  
Carnival finishes 3.00 pm

**TRANSPORT:** If possible all students are to be dropped off at the Aquatic Centre (8.30 am) and picked-up (3.00 pm) from the Aquatic Centre. If students are unable to organise transport directly to the pool they are to come to Chanel. The student will be taken to and from the pool by the Chanel Bus. In the afternoon, all students who need to catch buses from Chanel College will be returned to the College in time to do so.

**UNIFORM:** *All students must be wearing their House shirt, a wide brimmed hat and footwear (thongs or shoes)*

- Shorts must be appropriate for a Swimming Carnival (board shorts allowed).
- All students **MUST** wear sunscreen throughout the day (this will be supplied for you)
- Footwear **MUST** be worn while entering and leaving the Aquatic Centre and pool (thongs are acceptable).
- Bikinis are not appropriate wear for a College swimming carnival
- 1 piece togs for girls and swimming shorts for boys to be worn when in the water.
- Bring a towel, food/snacks, sunscreen & plenty of water

**HATS:** Wide brimmed hats **MUST** be worn all day.

Your hat **MUST** be on your head as you enter the Aquatic Centre otherwise you will be sent back to the College by bus to collect your College hat (and an infringement will be issued). **NO CAPS ALLOWED .**

**FOOD:** A very limited range of food is available from the Pool Canteen. Students are encouraged to bring their lunch and snacks. Remember to **bring** a water bottle.

- ◆ Students log onto the Google Student Homepage and click on this image at the top of the student homepage.
- ◆ Students to bookmark this link for future reference.
- ◆ Student login details are the same as chromebook login details.
- ◆ What can Students See??
  - ◆ Students will have access to their timetable and will be able to view it daily or as the entire timetable, any excursions that they are invited to, attendance, any co-curricular activities they have participated in and their latest school photo.
- ◆ Tab Breakdown
- ◆ Home – Takes students back to the homepage
- ◆ My Classes – Student can view their timetable for the current day or their full timetable
- ◆ eDiary – Students can view multiple events in their Calendar that are relevant to their year level by selecting/ticking in the relevant tick boxes in the Calendar Feeds box on the right-hand side of the page. The calendar can be viewed by day, week or month by selecting one on the top right side of the page.
- ◆ Students can select Daily Notices in the drop-down box and will have access to all daily notices live all day (Daily Notices will no longer need to be printed and collected from the office)
- ◆ School Links – Brings up the current links set up for this student
- ◆ My Activities – Students can select Co-Curricular from the drop-down box and are able to then see all extra-curricular activities they have participated in.
- ◆ If students select Tours and Excursions, they can see any upcoming excursions they have. Notes for the excursion will also be available for them to see as an attachment.
  - ◆ Students are unable to accept or decline attendance to the excursion .
- ◆ My History – Students can select Academic Reports from the drop-down box and see all their previous reports.
- ◆ Extra-Curricular will bring up a summary of all extra-curricular activities the student has participated in during their time at Chanel.
