FROM THE PRINCIPAL—Dr Susan Bunkum PhD



There is no doubt that the use of digital technologies and social media has transformed our lives in such a way that it is hard to imagine how we ever lived without them!

Unfortunately, 'sitting' right alongside all of the benefits associated with the use of all things digital, are the negatives that we hear about all too often – online hate speech, cyber bullying, sexting, image-based abuse, recording of inappropriate actions and posting them on social media platforms, contact with strangers on-line, accessing inappropriate material on-line, gaming addiction, and the list goes on and on!

It is these negative aspects associated with the use of digital technologies that present parents and educators with significant challenges. I would hazard a guess that there is no school or educational institution in this country that does not have to deal with the consequences of the misuse of digital technologies – and unfortunately, probably on a regular basis!

As a College, our concern is to educate young people about how to use digital technologies safely and in such a way that it promotes good. The awareness raising activities that we ran on Safer Internet Day (11 February) provided us with such an opportunity. Safer Internet Day is a global initiative which sees millions of people around the world unite to raise awareness about online safety issues and inspire positive change.

I would encourage all parents and young people to visit the website of the eSafety Commissioner (<https://www.esafety.gov.au/>) as it contains a wealth of information and strategies for healthy and positive use of digital technologies for parents, educators and young people.

Photography and Art Competition

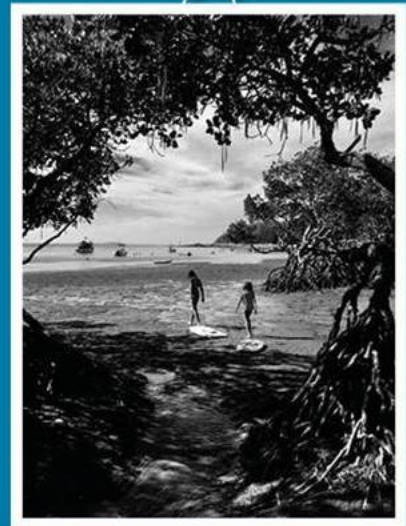
For all the budding artists and photographers at Chanel, there are two exciting competitions coming up.

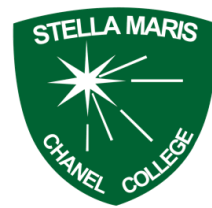

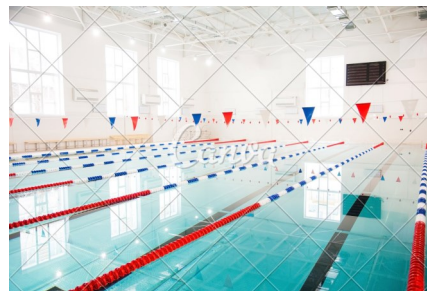

CHANEL COLLEGE SWIMMING CARNIVAL – Tuesday 18 FEBRUARY 2020

TIME: Pool opens 8.30 am
Roll marked 8.45 am
Events begin 9.00 am
Carnival finishes 3.00 pm



TRANSPORT: If possible all students are to be dropped off at the Aquatic Centre (8.30 am) and picked-up (3.00 pm) from the Aquatic Centre. If students are unable to organise transport directly to the pool they are to come to Chanel. The students will be taken to and from the pool by the Chanel Bus. In the afternoon, all students who need to catch buses from Chanel College will be returned to the College in time to do so.

UNIFORM: *All students must be wearing their House shirt, a wide brimmed hat and footwear (thongs or shoes)*

- Shorts must be appropriate for a Swimming Carnival (board shorts allowed).
- All students **MUST** wear sunscreen throughout the day (this will be supplied for you).
- Footwear **MUST** be worn while entering and leaving the Aquatic Centre and pool (thongs are acceptable).
- Bikinis are not appropriate wear for a College swimming carnival.
- 1 piece togs for girls and swimming shorts for boys to be worn when in the water.
- Bring a towel, food/snacks, sunscreen & plenty of water.

HATS: Wide brimmed hats **MUST** be worn all day.

Your hat **MUST** be on your head as you enter the Aquatic Centre otherwise you will be sent back to the College by bus to collect your College hat (and an infringement will be issued). **NO CAPS ALLOWED .**

FOOD: A very limited range of food is available from the Pool Canteen. Students are encouraged to bring their lunch and snacks. Remember to **bring** a water bottle.

- Parents and/or spectators can sit at the chairs and tables behind the shallow end. They will not be permitted to enter the swimming pool area.

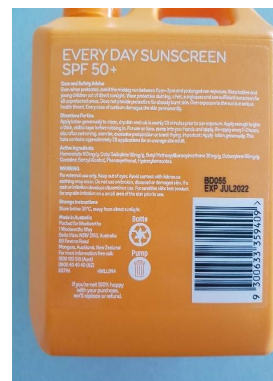
EARLY DEPARTURES

How do I apply?

Step 1

Visit www.defence.gov.au/workexperience and locate the 'Current Work Experience Placements' link to browse through a number of exciting Defence Work Experience placements on offer.

- Select one Defence Work Experience placement that you would like to participate in and **are able to attend**.
- To apply for this placement, you'll need to submit an online application via the 'Start New Application' link which can be found on the same page.
- Complete the online application questions and submit your application by clicking the 'submit now' button, **before the closing date**.
- Once you click the 'submit now' button, your application will be forwarded for review and consideration. You will also receive an automatically generated confirmation email as soon as you submit your application online.

Step 2

Advise your School Careers Adviser that you have submitted an application to participate in a Defence Work Experience placement.

Step 3

After the closing date and once all applications have been assessed, you will receive an email notifying you whether or not your application has been successful.

Step 4

If your application is successful, you will be required to complete a Work Experience Placement Agreement form which we will email to you and/or your school. The Work Experience Placement Agreement form must be signed by yourself, your parent/guardian; and your school principal/guidance counsellor.

Once you've obtained all the signatures you must return the Work Experience Placement Agreement form to the Defence email address provided to you. If the Work Experience Placement Agreement is not returned or signatures are missing, you may not be able to participate in the placement.

Step 5

If your Work Experience Placement Agreement form is completed in full, returned on time and contains all the signatures, Defence will provide approval for you to participate in an exciting Defence Work Experience placement.

You and your school will then be provided a copy of the approved Work Experience Placement Agreement as well as important student information related to attending and participating in your placement.

Where the number of applications for a placement far exceeds the number of placements that we are able to offer, Defence reserves the right to close placement applications earlier than originally stated.

Defence Work Experience Program

Defence is offering a wide variety of exciting work experience placement opportunities and is committed to providing a national work experience program designed to:

- Contribute to the development of the skills of young people,
- Provide students with opportunities to develop and gain confidence through meaningful, interactive and informative placements,
- Ease the transition of students into the workplace; and
- Offer a wide variety of interesting career opportunities within Defence.

Who is it for?

The Defence Work Experience Program is an inclusive program for all Australian students at a secondary school, university, TAFE or other places of education.

Students participating in Defence work experience placements must be at least 15 years of age at the time of the placement, and Australian Citizens or Permanent Residents.

All reasonable steps will be taken to include any person whose individual circumstances may necessitate special considerations to allow participation.

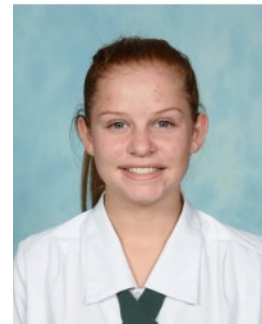

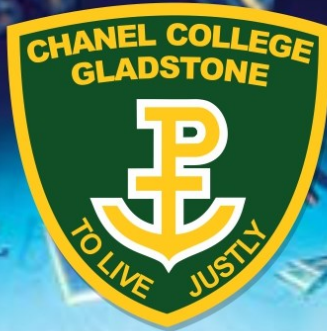
