LOVE BITES



May is Domestic and Family Violence Awareness month. The Coordinated Community Response to Domestic and Family Violence (CCR) is a multiagency organisation promoting awareness in the community through a number of events spread across the year. Last week our Year 10 students participated in the NAPCAN Loves Bites Program and our House Delegates attended the Remembrance Day ceremony at Friends Park, Barney Point. Our College community enthusiastically participated in a Paint The School Purple Day on Friday. To find out about other events for this month, CCR can be accessed via their Facebook page.

NAPCAN Love Bites is an educational program focussing on the development of positive relationships and violence prevention. The program is about preventing domestic and family violence and sexual assault. It was designed by the National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN). The Love Bites program consists of two interactive educational workshops on Domestic and Family Violence and Sexual Assault awareness followed by a creative workshop in the afternoon that consolidates the information from the morning sessions.

Throughout the day our students were encouraged to develop their skills in identifying safe, healthy and equitable relationships. The facilitators also explored conflict resolution and advised our students about how to access support services within our community, if required. Our current Year 10 students produced some magnificent artwork during the afternoon creative session. This artwork will be used in their 2019 campaign.

The facilitators of Love Bites are all members of the Coordinated Community Response to Domestic and Family Violence Committee. 
How can parents build resilience in their children?

Opportunity #2: Building Boundaries

Young people perform better when they have clear rules and consequences, and when they know that the adults in their lives expect the best of them.

Tips for parents to build boundaries and expectations for their children:

- · Be clear about the routines of family life: bedtime, sleep time, meal times
- · Ensure you know where your child is most of the time
- Have agreed clear rules about the use of computers and mobile phones at home, in the bedroom, when you have guests, after lights out
- Instill hope in young people. Let them know that you think great things are on offer for them and that you love them and believe in them
- · Encourage them to succeed at lots of things
- · Allow them to see they can improve with practice
- Encourage them to dream big about what their life can be
- Have a zero-tolerance approach to violence, rudeness and intimidation in your family.


