### Reflection

Welcome back everyone. Hoping everyone had a good break from school and are ready for an exciting eleven weeks ahead, filled with a Year 4 camp, parent/teacher interviews, NAPLAN testing, a plethora of sporting carnivals and trials, many meetings, the Eisteddfod, children's report cards, the preparation and celebration of Confirmation and the odd public holiday

The holidays are always a great opportunity to catch up on some reading and I found two interesting articles, one from the Sydney Morning Herald from Dr Jonathan King, a military historian and author of Gallipoli: Our Last Man Standing and Gallipoli Diaries, (He produced a film on the last 10 Anzacs) and another from Mrs Bronnie Ware, an Australian palliative care nurse.

The first speaks of ANZAC Day and he writes our nation should remember the words of our last Anzac, Alec Campbell, who pleaded on his deathbed: "For god's sake, don't glorify Gallipoli and war - it was a terrible fiasco, a total failure and best forgotten."

In our schools, we do not attempt to glorify war but to emphasise the ultimate sacrifice made by young men and women in the search of freedom and peace. As we are often told, ANZAC Day is for commemoration, not celebration. Let us hope our children learn to see beyond the movies and Playstation images of war and that their own, fragile lives are never darkened by such events.

ANZAC Day is next Wednesday 25th April. We will commemorate this day on Tuesday 24th at our whole school assembly with our year 6J class leading us. It will be a very reverent occasion I am sure, with ex-serviceman, Mr Paul Lancaster, speaking with our children about the importance of this day and his experiences in our Armed Forces.

On Wednesday, we are all asked to take part in the ANZAC march which commences at 9am, leaving from the old railway station across from the Railway Hotel and making its way to the Cenotaph. We will assemble at 8.20am and children marching are asked to be in their normal school uniforms with their school hats. Seeing photos from last year, our attendance at this march was overwhelming and I encourage as many of our families to make it along on this very, important occasion commemorating a defining event in our brief history. Water bottles are encouraged. Families are then asked to collect their children after the ceremony from our tent area.

Our dawn service will be held at 5am on the Yeppoon beachfront. I have really encouraged our Year 5s and 6s to attend this ceremony.

The second article was from nurse, Bronnie Ware who cared for patients in the final weeks of their lives. She recorded their dying epiphanies and has put her observations into a book called 'The Top Five Regrets of the Dying':

**1. I wish I'd had the courage to live a life true to myself, not the life others expected of me.** This was the most common regret. When people realise that their life is almost over and look back clearly on it, it is easy to see how many dreams have gone unfulfilled.

**2. I wish I hadn't worked so hard.** This came from every male patient. They missed their children's youth and their partner's companionship. Women also spoke of this regret.

**3. I wish I'd had the courage to express my feelings.** Many people suppress their feelings in order to keep peace with others. As a result, they settled for a mediocre existence and never became who they were truly capable of becoming.

**4. I wish I had stayed in touch with my friends.** They would not truly realise the full benefits of old friends until their dying weeks and it was not always possible to track them down. Many had become so caught up in their own lives that they had let friendships slip by over the years.

**5. I wish that I had let myself be happier.** Many did not realise until the end that happiness is a choice. They had stayed stuck in old patterns and habits. Fear of change had them pretending, that they were content, when deep within, they longed to laugh properly and have silliness in their life again.

Many of our young ANZACs never had the opportunity to reach an age where these regrets were evident. It is important to always reflect on our life to ensure there are meaning and fulfilment and time to thank those who have given the ultimate sacrifice in honour of our country.

## Parent-Teacher Interviews Week 2 and 3

## NAPLAN

On Tuesday 15th, Wednesday 16th, Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd May, all students in Years 3 and 5 will sit the annual National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests. Students need to be at school at 8:40am on these mornings. NAPLAN is made up of tests in the four domains of Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

As you are aware, our students will be undertaking the NAPLAN assessment online this year. NAPLAN online brings many advantages, including a design that offers test items tailored to students' knowledge and ability. Parents and carers of students in these NAPLAN year levels will need to be aware of important information relating to privacy, which can be found on the NAPLAN Online Queensland website: (<https://naplanonline.qld.edu.au/getting-ready/parent-information>).

NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how individual students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children.

The National testing program has been mandated by government bodies and therefore all students in Years 3 and 5 should be in attendance. It is therefore imperative that any extracurricular events are not timetabled for these days.

**Parent Requested Withdrawal from Testing:** Withdrawals are intended to address parental concerns such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. Parents/Carers wishing to withdraw students from the testing program must sign a '**Notice of Parent Withdrawal**' form by Tuesday, 8th May. A request form is available from our school office.

## Confirmation Preparation Session

Confirmation preparation will continue this Saturday evening April 21st. This is the final preparation session for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Candidates and their parent/ carer are asked to attend these sessions commencing at 5:15pm, followed by Mass at 6pm. Please continue to complete your Confirmation book. Candidates also need to have chosen a saint's name to be used in Confirmation.. Some useful saint sites are to follow. ## Capital Works At Sacred Heart

As you have seen, several capital works projects are being undertaken at our school. One of these is the student toilet refurbishment project. This will see all our student toilets refurbished, will take approximately six months and as a school community, we are looking forward to the upgraded facilities that this project will deliver. Our Prep C classroom is also being fully refurbished and this project will take 12 weeks.

The projects has presented certain planning challenges due to the number of toilet blocks spread across our school, as well as maintaining appropriate student facilities during the construction program.

Following is some important information about this project:

- A staged construction program will see selected toilet blocks closed to student use, while others remain operational. The closed toilet blocks will be clearly fenced off and secured as building compounds. There will be no student use of these fenced off facilities during the refurbishment. Upon completion of each stage, the new toilet blocks will be handed back to the school and reopened for student use. Contractors will then move to the next stage and repeat this process.
- The building contract has been awarded to GT Jeffreys Pty Ltd following the tender process. GT Jeffreys has a vast experience with school related building projects across the Rockhampton region. Our building project is being coordinated by Rockhampton Catholic Education Office and the project consultants, Tony Madden Architects. As part of the project planning, GT Jeffreys has gone through a detailed site induction process specific to the Sacred Heart project, highlighting all of the key requirements and project expectations. Scheduled fortnightly site meetings will ensure regularly monitoring of progress, site control.

I trust this provides you with the answers to some of the queries you may have regarding these planned works. Thank you for your support and patience associated with these important projects. Please do not hesitate to contact me to keep you updated and fully informed about these projects.
