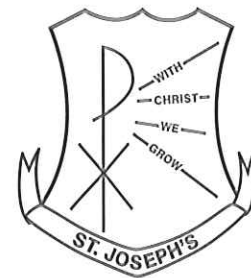

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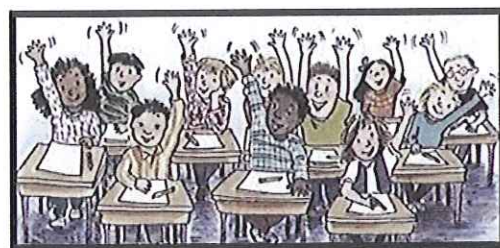

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Behaviour Management at our School

One of the important ongoing goals at St Joseph's is to assist our students as they progress through the primary grades to achieve the goal of self-discipline.

Our school operates with a set of positive expectations which are aimed to assist our students to achieve this goal and to ensure the safety and well-being of all our students.



Appropriate behaviour from students consists of the following principles:

1. Allowing the learning of other students to proceed;
2. Respecting the teacher's right to teach; and their actions-
3. Are not against their own best interests or the best interests of other students.



St Joseph's Policy on Behaviour Management believes in the essential goodness of children and respects the rights of the individual child to be educated in line with the school's Mission Statement. Children are encouraged to take responsibility for their actions and to move towards the development of self-discipline. This implies learning about good and poor choices, rights and responsibilities and acting, over time, in a manner that benefits self and the community of others that we are in relationship.

Developing self-discipline means first defining the guidelines and then assisting children to develop control of their own behaviour. Children need to understand clearly that they must accept responsibility for their own behaviour and that we at school and as parents at home, will expect them to accept such responsibility (appropriate to age level and maturity).

The development of 'self-discipline' does not happen by magic. To develop it requires an environment of clear and consistent guidelines and sympathetic, but consistent and fair enforcement of expectations. Children also need us, as adults,

to constantly make clear our reasons: that is, make clear to them the "values" which underlie our own beliefs. For example, "we believe in honesty because..." In this way children can be assisted, gradually, to take charge of their own lives

Not one of us is perfect. All people make mistakes and when problems arise we (i.e. staff and parents) should seek to assist our students, in a positive way, to develop appropriate behaviour patterns and to understand the standards required so that appropriate self-discipline can develop as the child matures.

The school community takes seriously its obligation to be fair and consistent when ensuring that children are aware of the consequences of good and poor behaviour in the class and playground. Our policies, behaviour management systems (Yellow and Red Cards, Planning Room and Lunch Room time-out and Rewards for good effort *etc.*) endeavour to support our families in teaching our children about rights and responsibility. Our Christian approach in the classroom and the school community is to respond with consistency and fairness, but as with all things involving human relationships, maturity, context, patience and discussion is always a necessary component when dealing with children.

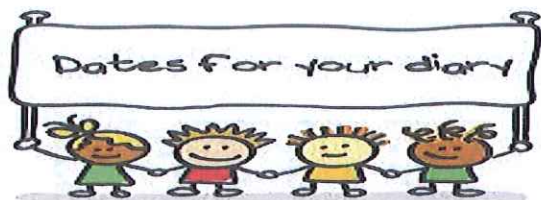

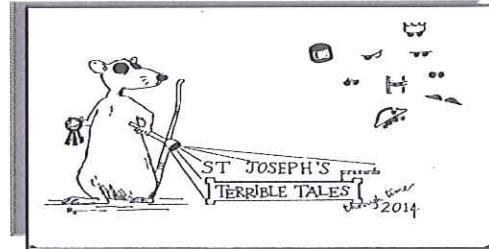
COST: Gold coin donation
