

Please put this on your fridge or in a prominent position to act as a reminder for 'Musical Week'.

### **MONDAY**

- ➤ All costumes to come to school for checking by the class teachers.
- Finalisation of Class Items in Hall
- > Dress Rehearsal at School teachers checking costumes. (No makeup required)
- Some costumes may go home and need to come back on Tuesday evening to the Entertainment Centre.
- Other costumes will stay at school

# **EXCLUSION OF SICK CHILDREN**



With the high incidence of ill children at this time of year, it's important to be very clear about responsibilities in regard to care of sick children.

Queensland Government Schools Policy stipulates that any student who suffers from the effects of diarrhoea or vomiting must be excluded from school for 24 hours after the symptoms cease. In the case of flu, students must be excluded until well.

In the interest of individual students and our school community, we do call parents immediately to come and collect their children as soon as possible if we believe they are unwell. Please ensure we have a correct, CONTACTABLE phone number on record to ensure your

child gets the care they need.
